Grade 12s

Program for Commencement

Guidance has posted the names of students who will be identified in the Commencement Program and will be recognized for achieving special certificates. The names will focus on those students who, according to school records, have completed all the requirements for their STEP Certificate, Specialist High Skills Major in Health Care, Specialist High Skills Major in Mining, French Immersion Certificate, as well as Extended French Certificate. It is crucial for students to check this list to ensure there are no disappointments.

Community Service Hours

To date, 90% of our Grade 12 students have completed their community service hours. Graduates are reminded that this is a graduation requirement! These hours must be completed before the end of the school year or post-secondary plans are in jeopardy. Please be aware that on a regular basis Guidance staff have ensured student volunteer hours are posted; announcements are made promoting volunteer opportunities. Students have also received individual reminder slips as well as letters letting them know the exact number of community service hours still owing to reach their minimum 40 hours. It is now in the hands of students and their parents/guardians to ensure this crucial diploma requirement is completed.

Ontario Student Assistance Program - OSAP

The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) provides a number of grants, which are accessible to students who are moving on to post-secondary. Applying for OSAP does not mean a student has to accept a financial aid package, but it does entitle a student to many unique opportunities, such as sponsored job opportunities on campus. OSAP determines eligibility and amounts for grants and loans based on both student and parent information. Students can complete the OSAP application form found at https://osap.gov.on.ca.

Grade 12 Medical Technology

This week students practiced acupuncture on bananas, after learning about applications of it in various branches of health care. In addition, students used our chest sound simulation manikins to learn how different heart and lung disorders are diagnosed.



Grade 10 Science

Have you ever suffered from heartburn? Have you ever wondered if one antacid works any better than the others? This week Grade 10 students have been hard at work determining which antacid is actually the most effective at making you feel better. It's a lengthy process involving crushing the antacid tablets, dissolving it in water, and finally testing several criteria for each antacid multiple times. The students were challenged with designing their titration experiment before actually getting into the lab.



So far they've put in a lot of effort in planning and carrying out their experiments. Once they are done in the lab, they will analyze their results and be able to tell you which antacid you should actually be buying!


Grade 10 Tech

3D Printing with AutoCAD by Dana Simeoni




Throughout the past weeks, Lockerby Tech students in Grade 10 have used AutoCad to design a useful object that they can 3D print. Students used skills they learned in class to design their own objects by practicing how to draw single view, rectangular, and cylindrical orthographic, isometric, 3D cylindrical, and rectangular drawings, and then designing something of their own choosing. I chose to make a 3D cannon keychain. It features a 4-wheel cannon base, and the cannon itself. Unfortunately, it does not work, but it does make a cute key chain! The process began with designing the cannon using AutoCAD, then submitting it to print. When I finished printing, a white replica of my AutoCAD drawing was sitting in my hands. I broke off the excess plastic and then sanded to the required shape I wanted. I glued the cannon on its base, then proceeded to paint it. After painting, a clear coat went on and I had my cannon key chain!


What's New in the Library?




