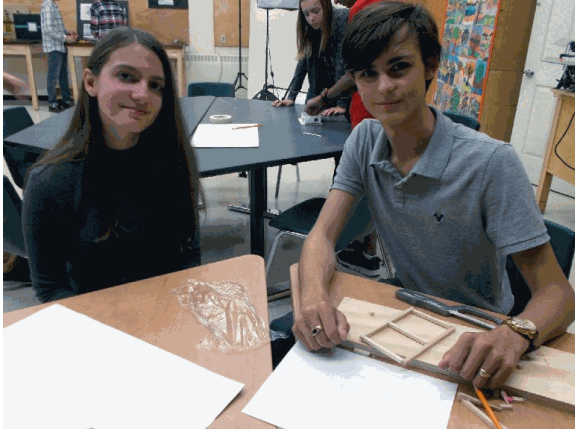
Breakfast Club is starting up, and we are looking for student volunteers. If you are interested, please see Mr. Peloso in Room 210 for more details and scheduling.

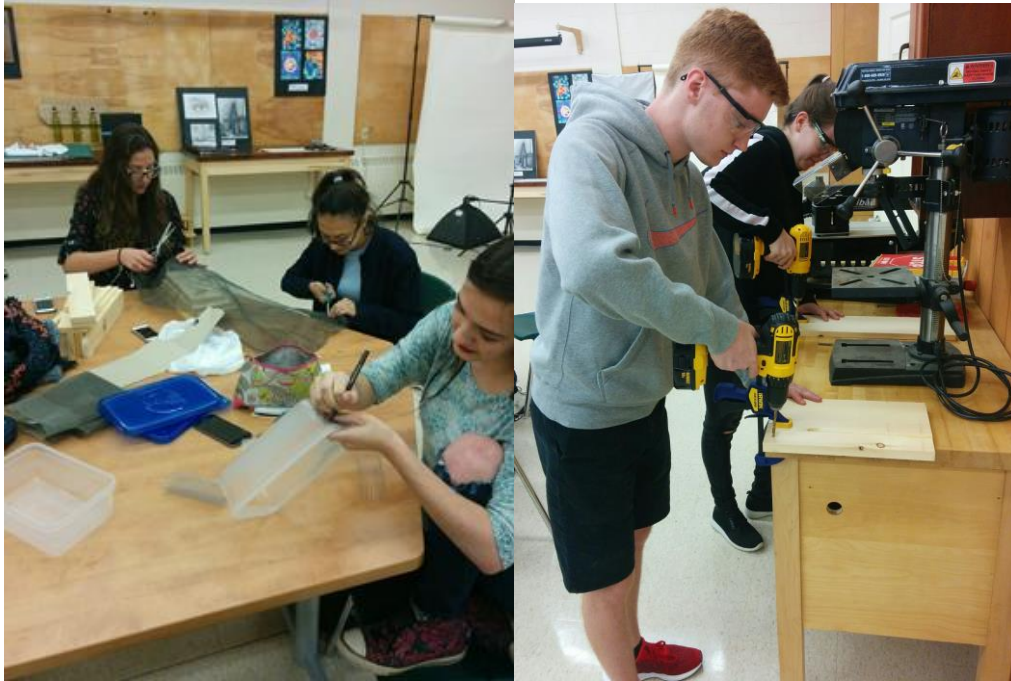
### AP Capstone (Grade 12)

The beginning of the new school year brings the first week of classes for Lockerby's AP Capstone Students. The class kicked off their course with a look at current issues, learning how to modify simple, closed questions into questions that require complex and thought-provoking answers. Students also had the opportunity to discuss their summer assignments, holding an animated class discussion about their opinions on where ideas come from. The AP program will teach students valuable communication, research, and collaboration skills, to prepare them for university and professional scholarly environments.



### Grade 12 Forensic Biology

We are only three days into the school year, but the Grade 12 Forensic Biology class is already off and running with their forensic entomology project. Students used the STEAM room to design and build structures to contain their experiments. They get to choose their own variable to investigate and have designed an experiment to test the impact of this factor on the rate that insects might decompose a body.
