#### Post-Secondary Applications - Final Reminder

This is a final reminder that the applications have specific deadlines; it is essential for students to meet these deadlines in order to be considered for their chosen program.

#### Application Deadlines

University – Wednesday, January 17, 2018 (\$150 fee for 3 programs); It is recommended that students pay by credit card to ensure that their application is processed in time. Note: OUAC is indicating that using online banking would be too late by this point.

Colleges – Thursday, February 1, 2018 (\$95.00 fee for 5 programs); it is recommended that students pay by credit card to ensure that their applications are processed as quickly as possible.

#### Graduation Gowns

A number of students have rented their graduation gowns through the Guidance Department. If students are interested in attending our convocation this spring, they are reminded that they must see a Guidance counsellor as soon as possible to rent their gowns. A second order with Gaspard & Sons Graduation Gowns will be placed on January 27, 2018. This will be the **final order for the 2018 convocation**. There is a \$50.00 fee for the gown rental.

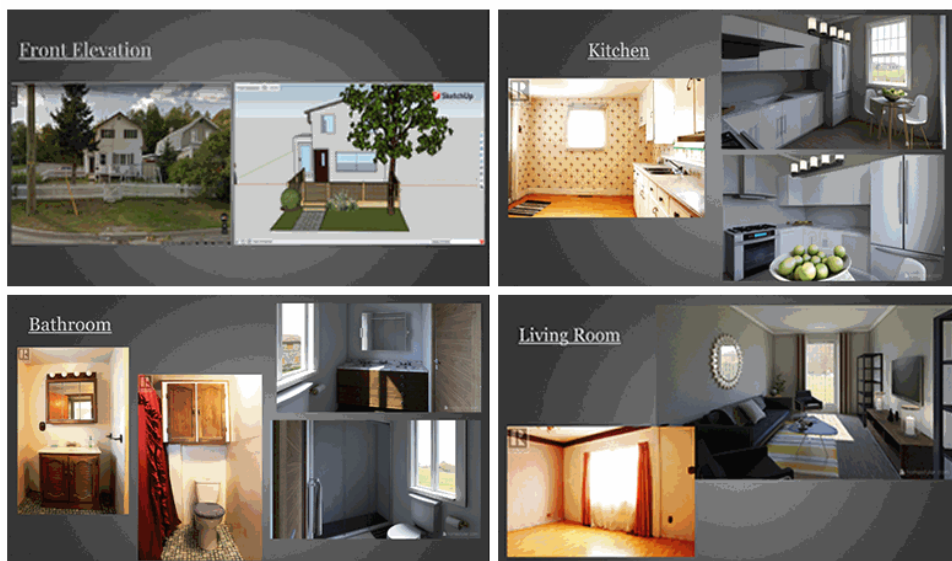
#### Pond Hockey Festival on the Rock 2018
