Lockerby Receives Student Voice SpeakUp Grant

Raksheen Khan and Rayaq Siddiqui under the mentorship of Ms. Beaudry applied for a SpeakUp Grant. Lockerby was successful in their application and will be receiving \$2 500 to support their May 10 *Lockerby Hygge Conference*. In addition to this funding, Lockerby is also receiving a grant from Wolves United to help further fund this day.

The conference obtained its inspiration from the Norwegian word *hygge* which means well-being. The book by Meik Wiking describes how "Hygge is about an atmosphere and an experience, rather than about things. It is about being with people we love. A feeling of home. A feeling that we are safe, that we are shielded from feeling that we are safe, that we are shielded from the world and allow ourselves to let our guard down."

With this in mind, Raksheen and Rayaq have helped organize a wellness day for Lockerby students and RDSB Grade 7 students. Lockerby students will have the opportunity to listen to guest speaker Wali Shah who uses

spoken word poetry to address many topics facing our youth today, including mental wellness. In addition to that, local Grade 7 students have been invited to listen to Wali Shah and attend interactive workshops where they can develop skills of resiliency, well-being and begin to fill their mental well-being toolkits.

Taking Tech to the Workshop

Grade 11 Tech



Have you ever wondered what to do with that old table, lamp, or pair of skis that are cluttering up your garage? Why not turn them into something new. This week, interior design students are breathing new life into old objects in order to create artful designs. Inspirations for this design challenge are varied. Some students come in with a product they want to make, and then we collaborate on finding the raw materials. Other students just search for an interesting item and imagine a variety of products that could be created. The real challenge is that we are not allowed to spend any money on materials, so the class comes together as a creative community to find old wood, paints and materials at no cost. In the course of this project, we learn a variety of hands-on skills related to woodworking, welding, electrical, drafting and design.

Alex is repurposing old steel pipe and a slab of oak into an attractive shoe rack in the industrial furniture style. In the process, he has milled and finished a rough slab of wood, and learned how to cut and thread pipe to assemble the base with repurposed fittings.



Abbie has chosen to reconstruct an old coffee table and create a chalkboard playing surface that can be added to the table as the need arises. In the process, Abbie has learned about woodworking and finishing techniques and has mixed her own chalkboard paint, using black latex paint and tile grout mix.
