### Lockerby Student Accepted into Prestigious Page Program in Ottawa

Kayleigh Jeanveau, a Grade 12 student, has been accepted into the prestigious Page Program in Ottawa. Kayleigh is graduating this June, following four years of study in the Science Technology Education Program (STEP).

Approximately 40 new Pages a year are accepted into the program from across Canada.

To be considered, Kayleigh completed an in-depth application process that began in the fall and included many stages of interviews. As part of the application, she was required to write an essay and conduct an interview to demonstrate bilingual skills.

According to ourcommons.ca, as a Page, Kayleigh will "...work in the House of Commons Chamber and provide various services to Members of Parliament, the Speaker and Chair Occupants, and Table Officers. Professional, impartial, and efficient service is a hallmark of the House of Commons Page Program."

This fall, Kayleigh will pursue an Honours Bachelor of Commerce with a specialization in Marketing at the University of Ottawa. She believes that the ties between politics and business will definitely serve her well as she looks to the future.

#### Completion of Timetables for University

Students wishing to obtain a third credit must register for the session that runs from Tuesday, July 3, 2018 to Friday, August 24, 2018. Students registering for Summer Co-op must include a credit counselling summary from their current school so that the proper Co-op course codes can be applied. Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to their placements.

### Grade 12 Med Tech

Throughout the course of this semester we have taken on a challenge to try and change the stigma regarding homelessness in Sudbury. We have given cheeseburgers to individuals residing at a homeless shelter that we visited in downtown Sudbury, handed out lunches, and have also brainstormed ideas to help the less fortunate.


Tasha and I explored Sudbury's vital signs and noticed a significant problem with smoking rates in the Greater Sudbury Area. Therefore, Tasha and I decided to learn more about the negative impacts of smoking, and then develop a presentation for others. On June 5, we went to MacLeod Public School to educate a Grade 7 class on the negative effects of smoking in hopes of decreasing the city's smoking rates. Specifically, we presented a slide show that highlighted the biological, social, psychological, and environmental effects of smoking, and how hard it is to quit smoking. Additionally, we had four interactive activities for the MacLeod students, and they were most intrigued by the “tar jar activity.” In this activity, we gave each student a 16 oz cup filled with molasses, cooking oil and dirt, to demonstrate how much tar will go into the lungs of a smoker, either permanently or temporarily, who smokes 10 cigarettes a day for one year. Overall, we think our initiative was a success, as the teacher of the class we spoke to, told Tasha and I, “none of the kids in this class will ever be smokers,” at the end of our presentation.
