# GRADE 10 ENRICHED MATHEMATICS CHALLENGE

This week the students in Mrs. MacLennan's mathematics class were given a special assignment. They were challenged to retrieve Chemical X (a compound formulated to increase brain activity and stimulate super intelligence) before it fell into the wrong hands. 


# **GRADE 10 LITERACY TEST**

Each student in Ontario must write the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) as it is a graduation requirement and is written province-wide during Grade 10. The test is based on reading and writing skills from Grade 9. This year's test is March 27, 2019. A score of 300 or higher is deemed as successful. If a student is unsuccessful there is the option of taking the Ontario Literacy Course (OLC) at Summer School or taking the course semester 1 at Lockerby. Upon successful completion of the OLC course the student will meet the literacy graduation requirement and also receive a credit.

On Wednesday, October 3, 2018 all grade 10 students will be writing a sample booklet of OSSLT in one of their classes. Lockerby teachers will volunteer their time and mark the practice test and provide feedback to students. The results of the practice will be used to help provide additional supports in preparation for the March 27, 2019 test.


