LCS STUDENTS LOVING THE OUTDOORS!

The outdoor activities class travelled to Killarney Provincial Park this week for their backcountry wilderness canoe trip. On day one, students hiked into the clouds climbing over 1000-ft to the top of Silver Peak, before paddling and portaging to Johnnie Lake. At the Lake, our Vikings set up camp, cooked supper, and did some fishing for bass and pike. On day two, our students paddled non-stop for three hours across two lakes and through one swamp- trying to make camp before 'the storm' hit. Despite successfully making it to the campsite on Carlyle Lake in time, the decision was made to end the trip a day early with the forecast of heavy rain, severe thunderstorms, and dangerous winds. The bus picked up a very wet group of our Vikings students, who were disappointed they did not get to 'hike the Crack,' but were glad they did not have to paddle and portage across three more lakes into a headwind!

Wednesday, October 10th is **Wear Purple Day** in support of the Northern Cancer Foundation (NCF) where all of our Cancer Drive donations go.


Thursday, October 11th is **Vike Wear Day** in support of our Motivational Assembly.

Secondary school students are invited to start planning their post-secondary journey during the fall University Information Program sessions.

The event is designed to assist graduating secondary school students with making informed decisions before applying to university. The event also aims to help younger students choose high school courses relative to their preferred future university programs.

Students can also learn about admission requirements, scholarship opportunities and the application process.
