APCapstone



PRINCESS ANNE STUDENTS VISIT LOCKERBY COMPOSITE



Laurentian University Campus (University of Sudbury)

YMCA - John Island Camp

YMCA (John Island Camp) has partnered with the YMCA Academy to offer high school course credits with their youth leadership program.

Greenway (Ages 15-16)

Session A: June 30th - July 26th, 2019or Session B: July 28th - August 23rd, 2019

Greenway is the first year of YMCA's youth leadership program. Greenways will spend 2 weeks learning about personal leadership and gaining skills in camp activities. They will then spend 2 weeks on a camping trip, canoeing in Killarney provincial park and sea-kayaking on the North Channel of Lake Huron, and completing their ORCKA canoe tripping level 1 certification. Participants can opt to participate in a Grade 10 Health Active Living Education course (PAI2O).

Norquay (Ages 16-17)

June 30th - August 23rd, 2019

Norquay is the second year of YMCA's youth leadership program. Norquays will spend 3.5 weeks in camp participating in leadership training and a counselling placement. During this time, participants will complete their standard first aid certification and bronze cross swimming certification. The other 4.5 weeks will be spent on a wilderness whitewater canoeing expedition. Participants will complete their ORCKA canoe tripping level 2 certification. Participants can opt to participate in a Grade 11 Interdisciplinary studies course with a focus on outdoor leadership and personal development (IDC30).
