

Swimming

The Lockerby Swim Team travelled to the Pan Am pool in Scarborough to compete in one of the largest swim meets in North America. Over 2,000 high school and club swimmers competed over a two day period. Our relay team comprised of Ella, Breanna, Quinn, and Sarah shaved off over 10 seconds from their entry time while Logan, Dawson, and Patrick had personal bests in their individual events! Alex captured a 5th and a 7th place award in the 100m backstroke and 100m butterfly respectively. The most decorated swimmer of the event was two-time gold medalist Thomas who claimed the 100m individual medley and the 100m freestyle stroke. Thomas went on the break the 100m individual medley OFSAA record which will unlikely be touched for some time!



NEW ZEALAND AND AUSTRALIA TRIP

This year's spring break tour provided an opportunity to travel to the amazing countries of New Zealand & Australia. The school will be open in the morning, and regular scheduled classes will be run in the afternoon. After lunch, all students will attend periods 1, 2, 3, and 4. If students arrive in the morning and are not writing the test, they can use this time to work on projects and receive extra help in assigned areas.
