## LOCKERBY STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN FIRST AID TRAINING

This week, fourteen students across the Health & Wellness, Mining, and Information & Communication Technologies SHSM (Specialist High Skills Major) Programs completed one part of their Red Cross First Aid Training. This training included instructions about how to put together an effective first aid kit, how to assist someone who is choking, how to dress an external bleeding wound, and how to perform CPR. Students were able to practice the various techniques on each other and on mannequins. The hands-on aspect of the training really helped to reinforce what they were learning. The final part of training will occur on April 9th when students are sure to benefit again from Réal's wealth of knowledge and humour!

#### 3-D DESIGN

This week grade 10 students in Mr. Smith's technology class explored the intuitive Autodesk program Fusion 360. After completing a series of designs, students were able to design their own personal model. There were few limits on the drawing: students could design anything so long as it was under  $60\text{cm}^2$ . Once the students were finished their drawing of choice, they had the opportunity to print their model on a 3-D printer using either green, orange, or white filament. It was an interesting experience for the students, who were able to watch the entire printing of their design. The pictures show are designs created by Anthony D., and Rebecca S. Anthony constructed a scale model of a Bombardier CRJ 550 airplane while Rebecca created a miniature recorder!

On March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019, students in the Health and Wellness SHSM program went to Science North to participate in team building activities. Some of these activities included, setting up a tent blindfolded while one another student sat on a chair and directed them through the steps. Another activity was passing a ball from one person to another while only having one hand touching the ball at a time. After lunch, students made their way up to the Sudbury Outpatient Centre and participated in simulations set up for professional training. Some of the simulations included, a colonoscopy, putting in an IV, practicing CPR and using an AED, and finally they experienced a real life simulation, with a student behind the computer controlling what the robotic patient was experiencing as the other students practiced real life treatments to try and save the patient's life.
