

LOCKERBY YOGA!




LITERACY TEST 2020


On April 24th, 2019 all Grade 9 students will be writing a pre-diagnostic literacy test. The information and results from this pre-diagnostic test will be used to support our students in their Grade 10 classes and in preparation for the OSSLT in March 2020.

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is written by students in their Grade 10 year and is based on reading and writing skills they have learned up to the end of Grade 9. Students must achieve a provincial standard of scoring a minimum of 300 out of 400 in order to be deemed successful on the OSSLT. Students are asked to have any outstanding hours submitted to Guidance by April 26th, 2019 to ensure that this graduation requirement is completed and processed in sufficient time for diplomas.
