


SUDBURY SCIENCE FAIR WINNER!

Nethra's Project:

Neuropsychiatric Interconnect Wearable System Using CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy)

"My project was the creation of a wearable sensor that tracked a user's heart rate, skin tension, and skin temperature to monitor the relevant physical symptoms of depression and anxiety. The user was then diagnosed and given treatment for either disorder through an app I designed that contained a cognitive behavioural therapy treatment plan."

10. "Une connexion entre moi et les corbeaux existe depuis ma naissance. On dit qu'ils veillent sur moi."



LITERACY TEST 2020

On April 24th, 2019 all Grade 9 students will be writing a pre-diagnostic literacy test. The information and results from this pre-diagnostic test will be used to support our students in their Grade 10 classes and in preparation for the OSSLT in March 2020.

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is written by students in their Grade 10 year and is based on reading and writing skills they have learned up to the end of Grade 9. Students must achieve a provincial standard of scoring a minimum of 300 out of 400 in order to be deemed successful on the OSSLT.
