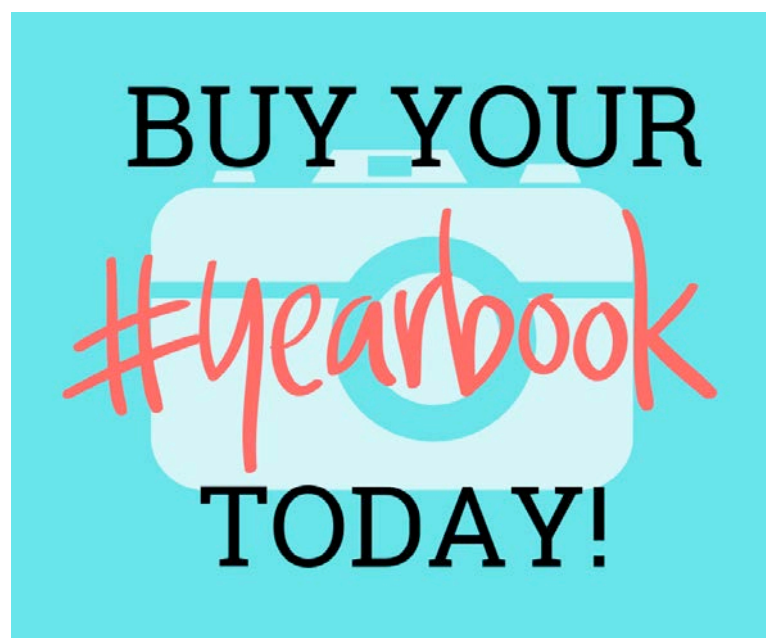
LOCKERBY COMPOSITE MEETS THE BIG APPLE

Recently, she earned a gold medal in Shot Put at the City Championships as well as at the NOSSA Championships in North Bay on Wednesday. 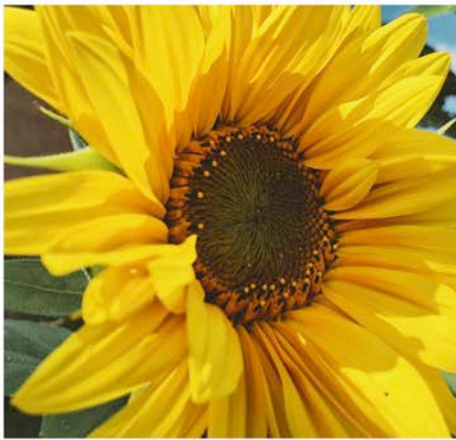
TASTE TEST DAY

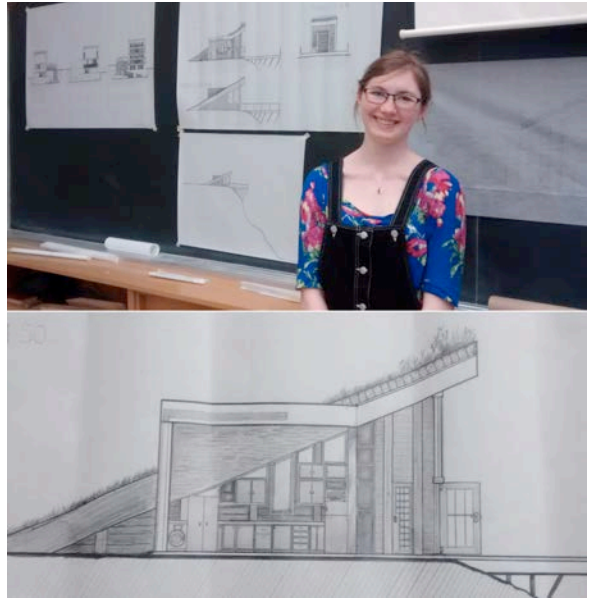


TECHNOLOGY DESIGN GUEST SPEAKER

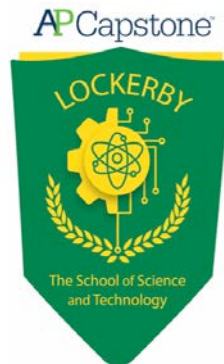

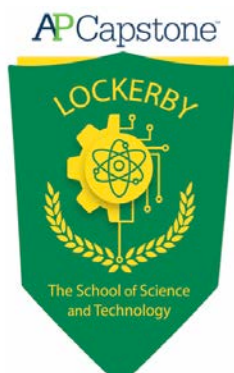

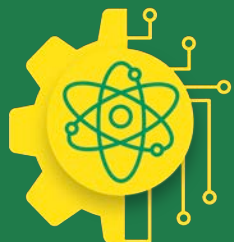
