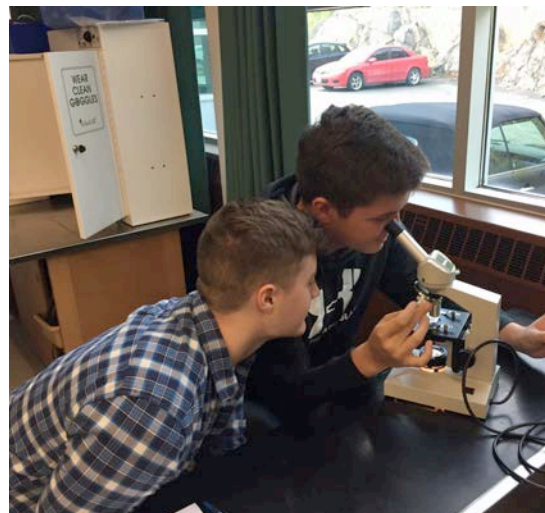

## AP BIOLOGY

This week in AP Biology, students have been performing laboratories to investigate topics in cell transport. On Tuesday, students built model cells filled with various unknown sucrose solutions, and ranked their concentrations based on their behaviour in water. On Wednesday, they built another model cell and tested the behaviour of glucose and starch, using the skills they learned previously to detect the presence of these substances in different solutions. On Thursday, the class performed plasmolysis in an onion cell, then also stimulated phagocytosis in live *Paramecia*! They then fed the single-celled creatures some yeast that was stained, and were able to observe them eating it. Cool!





## THIS WEEK IN VISUAL ARTS . . .

Too often in art, we get bogged down with rendering something that looks 'exactly as it should.' That's the power of left-brain thinking, and it's not easy to abandon. Theories suggest that the left side of our brain is all about logic and facts, while the right side of our brain is more engaged in areas that deal with the imagination and creativity. Big competition for a brain in school!

Senior Visual Art students are launching into a still life unit and, to help them focus on observational drawing and loosen-up, they were challenged to use the right side of their brain by drawing blind contours. Have you ever tried to draw your hand **WITHOUT** looking at your paper? It's not an easy task, but that's what grade 11 students were doing this week. The result? A lot of laughs and some wonderful surprises!



## ENGLISH CLASS MEETS BIOLOGY CLASS: BRAINS ALIVE!

Yes, this is an English class...and a biology class! This week, AP Seminar paired-up with AP Biology to investigate the way our brains work. Retired Lockerby Composite teachers Mr. P. Levan and Ms. R. Lenti led a brain dissection, and discussed how different centres of the brain affect perception in different ways. Perception is an overall theme that is investigated in AP Seminar class. Later, our students gained insight into how the brain learns and how to optimize the brain's efficiency!

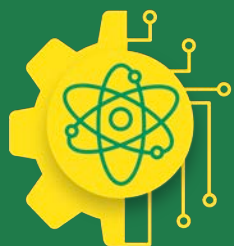
