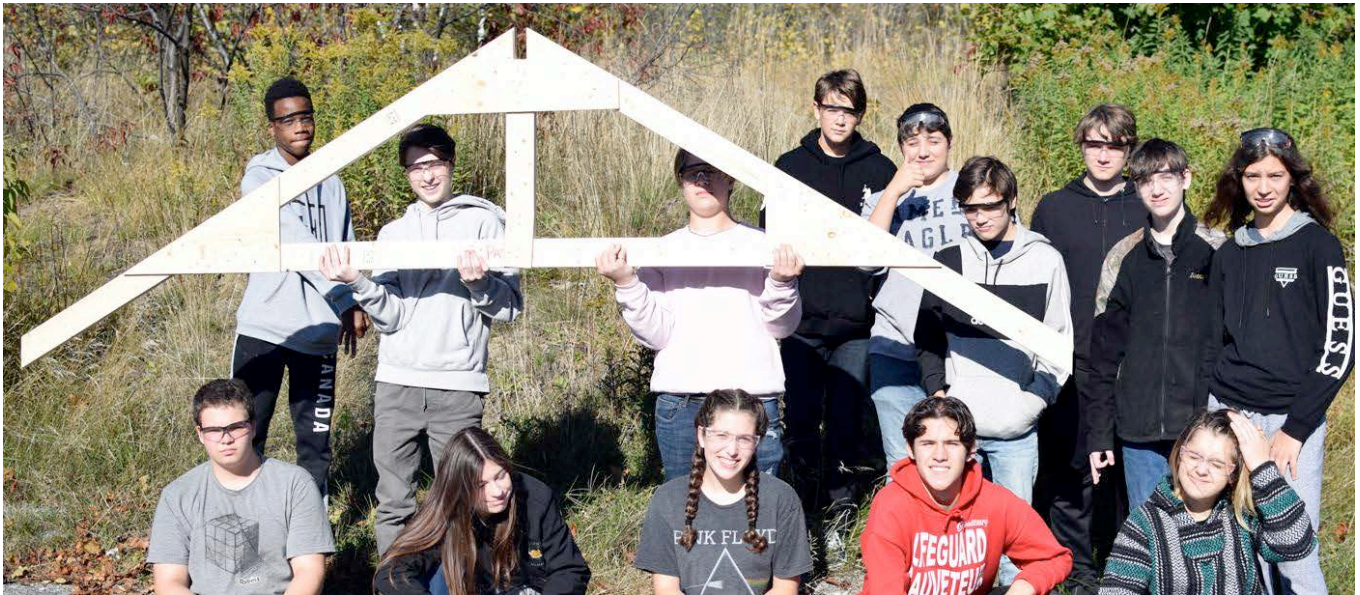

COMMUNITY BUILDING AND LOCKERBY COMPOSITE SCHOOL

Every year, Lockerby Composite's Construction Technology students engage in building projects for Camp Manitou: Bay of Islands. Camp Manitou is a not-for-profit children's camp that relies completely on volunteers for maintenance and summer programming. For the past 20 years, students have been fabricating buildings, docks, and outdoor furniture for the camp. This week, 24 of our grade 10 construction students completed the trusses for a new laundry building. They learned about roof framing, practiced using circular saws, and hammered hundreds of nails to finish this project. All the work was done in our shop, and will now be shipped to the campsite for final assembly!

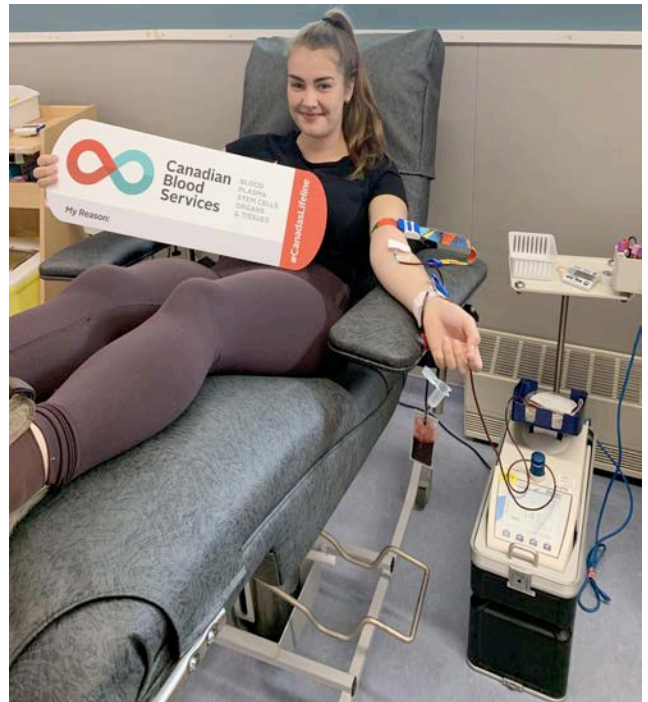
CONGRATULATIONS!

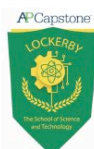

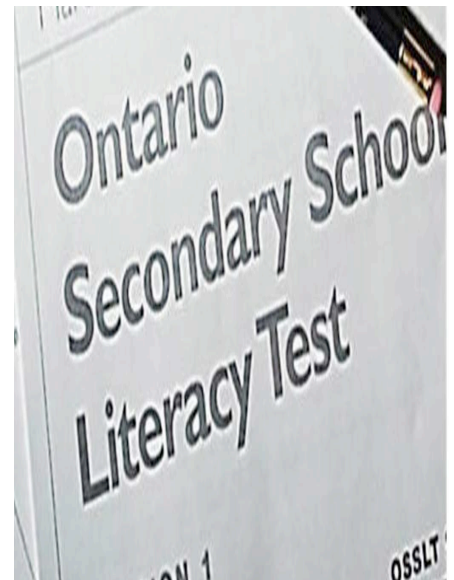

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT) 2020

Each student in Ontario must write the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) as it is a graduation requirement. The test itself is written province-wide during a student's Grade 10 year. The OSSLT is based on reading and writing skills from Grade 9. This year's test is Tuesday, March 31st, 2020. A score of 300 or higher is deemed as successful.

In addition to the supports our Grade 10 writers are receiving in their classes, Ms. Baggs has created a Google Classroom for the Grade 10 students to join. The joining code for students is **26uxixm**. In the Google Classroom students will be able to find tips, sample responses, and important dates that will be posted throughout the school year! 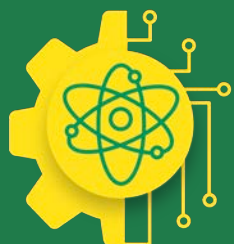
