

TODAY'S WEATHER: CLOUDY WITH A CHANCE OF BURGERS!

Students in Lockerby Composite's Grade 10 Construction Class completed their BBQ cleaners today. They were challenged to design a unique BBQ scraper out of wood by following the engineering design process. Our Vikings made sketches of different shapes, and then chose one to develop into a full scale technical drawing. They then used the drawing as a pattern to make the scraper from a piece of rough hardwood. Students then applied a coat of mineral oil to seal the wood and make the colour pop. For many of our students, this was our first opportunity to make a piece of custom woodwork, and the focus was on shaping and sanding it as smoothly as possible, as if creating a piece of art! All students achieved success, and enjoyed a class BBQ as a fitting celebration of their efforts!



THE POWER OF FUSION

Some of our grade 10 students are developing their Fusion 360 skills by making some interesting shaped objects that feature common manufacturing elements such as chamfers, fillets, counter-bores, among others. In addition to assigning materials and paint to their components, the students are now learning how to render their final products using HDRI backgrounds. This adds even more realism to their final models as the two images below demonstrate. #FATBEARWEEK2019



ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT) 2020

Each student in Ontario must write the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) as it is a graduation requirement. The test itself is written province-wide during a student's Grade 10 year. The OSSLT is based on reading and writing skills from Grade 9. This year's test is Tuesday, March 31st, 2020. A score of 300 or higher is deemed as successful.

In addition to the supports our Grade 10 writers are receiving in their classes, Ms. Baggs has created a Google Classroom for the Grade 10 students to join. The joining code for students is **26uxixm**. In the Google Classroom students will be able to find tips, sample responses, and important dates that will be posted throughout the school year!
