

## **A**PCapstone

RE: Ontario Secondary School Practice Literacy Test (OSSLT) 2019 and Condensed Schedule for Tuesday, November 19, 2019

Home to the Science Technology Education Program (STEP)

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The OSSLT is a graduation requirement administered by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO). The test assesses the reading and writing skills that students are expected to have learned in all subjects by the end of Grade 9, as outlined in *The Ontario Curriculum*.

In order to accommodate the practice test on Tuesday, November 19, 2019, Lockerby will have a short period day. The school will be open in the morning, and regular scheduled classes will run in the afternoon. After lunch all students will attend Periods 1, 2, 3 and 4. If students arrive in the morning and are not writing the test, they can use this time to work on projects and receive extra help in assigned areas.

All eligible students will be writing the practice OSSLT in the morning. Students are to arrive at school at the regular time and report to their assigned testing room. Below is the schedule for the day:

Students who successfully pass the March OSSLT will obtain their graduation requirement and will <u>not</u> be required to write the test again. Students who are unsuccessful will have the options of taking a course in Summer School or signing up for the Ontario Literacy Course being offered at Lockerby Composite School during the 2020-2021 school year.

Please mark **Tuesday**, **March 31**, **2020** in your calendar to ensure that your child is present at school for the official OSSLT test administration date. You can help your child prepare for the test by accessing an online practice version at <a href="https://www.eqao.com/en/assessments/eqao-online">www.eqao.com/en/assessments/eqao-online</a>. They can also use this interactive Gsuite site as well for extra test prep (<a href="http://gsuitehelp.ca/osslt/">http://gsuitehelp.ca/osslt/</a>) and join the Google classroom using code 26uxixm.
