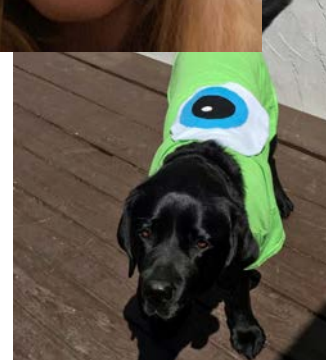

**RE: VIRTUAL GRADUATIONS CONTINUE AT ALL RAINBOW SCHOOLS**

Dear parents/guardians:

When the Province announced that students would be learning remotely for the remainder of the school year, the government raised the possibility of outdoor graduation ceremonies.

We know how important graduations are for students and families. They are also important to the administrators, teachers and support staff who work with students to nurture success.

Health and safety, however, is equally as important and remains our first and foremost priority. Outdoor gatherings for graduations would contravene the [safe reopening guidelines](#).

Given the ongoing focus on health and safety, the planning that has already occurred and the costs that have been incurred, virtual graduations will continue at all Rainbow Schools. Students, staff, families and friends will join together to celebrate from a safe distance.

Please be assured that schools are going the extra mile to make graduations meaningful and memorable. Some schools may invite students to pick up a graduation souvenir or take a photo on an individual basis in compliance with provincial limits on the size of outdoor gatherings. This month, all students who are 12 years of age and older at the time of vaccination and their caregivers have an opportunity to receive a first dose of COVID-19 vaccine to protect themselves and those around them. Second doses will be administered prior to the start of the 2021-2022 school year.

As students and families become immunized, this will go a long way in ensuring a full return to school activities, including in-person learning, sports, clubs, and, indeed, graduations.

We are all awaiting the day when we can return to some sense of normalcy. With each passing week, I am confident we are inching our way closer and closer. Let's continue to be guided by Public Health, with health and safety first and foremost.

## RE: VACCINATION CLINICS - YOUTH 12+ AND THEIR CAREGIVERS

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Public Health Sudbury & Districts is offering COVID-19 vaccination clinics for youth and their caregivers the weeks of June 14th and June 21st, 2021. Youth must be 12 years of age at time of vaccination. These clinics are for first dose vaccine only. Second doses will be scheduled starting August 22, 2021.

There are three options for participating in these clinics.

**Option 1: School block vaccination clinics during the school day**  
**IMPORTANT: YOU MUST COMPLETE THE REGISTRATION [SURVEY](#)**  
**BY WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9, 2021 FOR OPTION 1.**

School block vaccination clinics are available for students and caregivers for each school in Sudbury, Espanola and Manitoulin.

**Note: All regularly scheduled classes will continue during the daytime clinics.**

- Youth and caregivers are required to register for school block vaccination clinics by completing this registration [survey](#) **by noon on Wednesday, June 9th, 2021.**
- Youth and caregivers can also attend using personal or public transportation.
- Free bus transportation will be provided by the Sudbury Student Services Consortium. No supervision will be provided on buses. School boards will provide student supervision at the clinics from bus drop-off to bus reloading. [Details about bus pick up and drop off times will be made available during the week of June 7th.](#)

Students must screen for COVID-19 prior to boarding the bus or attending a vaccination clinic. Please use the provincial [school screening](#) tool. Students must wear a mask at all times while awaiting and traveling on the bus and while at the vaccination clinic.

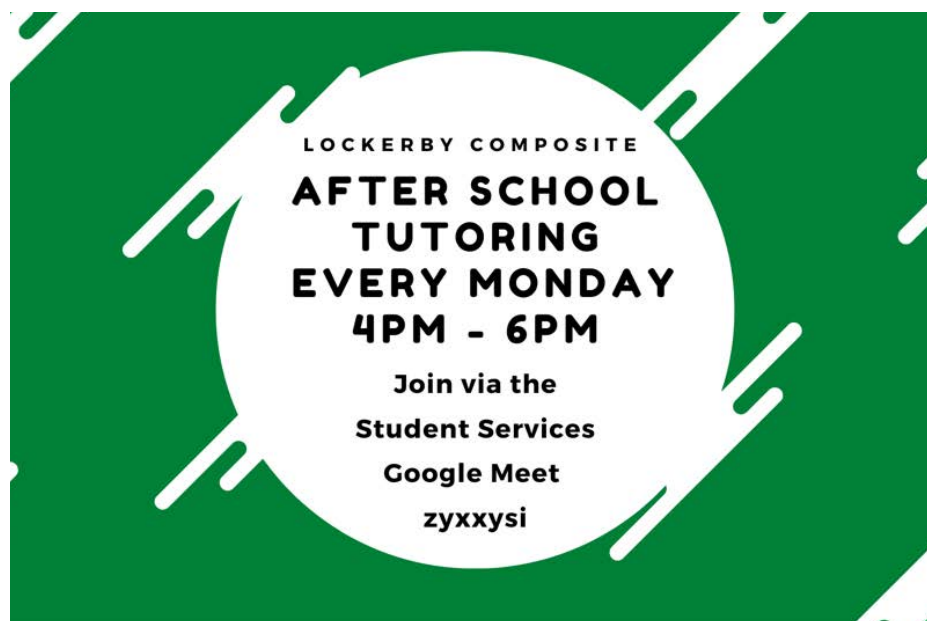

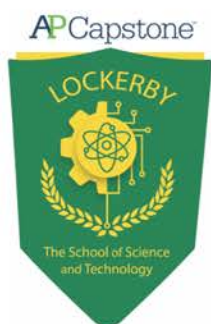

## Lockerby Composite School Culminating Activities Schedule

June 21<sup>st</sup> and June 22<sup>nd</sup> 2021

### Instructions and Information for Students

With the end of the school year arriving quickly, culminating tasks (in one or multiple components) will once again take the place of examinations. As such the following timelines have been established for Rainbow District School Board secondary schools:

- until June 18<sup>th</sup>, students will continue to receive daily instruction of course content from their teachers;
- until June 18<sup>th</sup>, students are expected to maximize these instructional opportunities in their courses in order to ensure that they are learning/consolidating as much of the course curriculum as possible this semester;
- Week 1 (Period 1 and Period 2 classes) culminating activities will begin to be assigned to students throughout the week of June 7<sup>th</sup>; culminating activity components will be completed outside of instructional hours by the end of the week;
- Week 2 (Period 3 and Period 4 classes) culminating activities will begin to be assigned to students throughout the week of June 14<sup>th</sup>; culminating activity components will be completed outside of instructional hours by the end of the week;
- June 21<sup>st</sup> will be the last day of scheduled Week 1 (Period 1 and Period 2) classes, with any final one-day culminating activity components being assigned for same-day submission;
- June 22<sup>nd</sup> will be the last day of scheduled Week 2 (Period 3 and Period 4) classes, with any final one-day culminating activity components being assigned for same-day submission;
- June 23<sup>rd</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> are days in which teaching staff may be connecting with students to conference about and wrap-up previously assigned culminating activities for further evaluation purposes;
- June 23<sup>rd</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> and June 28<sup>th</sup> are days in which teaching staff may be contacting parents/guardians to discuss the evaluation of culminating activities, current semester outcomes, and/or next steps for our next school year.

# STUDENT SERVICES

## Grade 12 Students

### Financial Assistance

Once students have decided on the postsecondary college, or university they want to attend, they can then apply for OSAP (if desired). This year, the application form is considered to be more user friendly! ### Laurentian University Orientation

Laurentian is setting the stage for an exciting Fall with a planned long-awaited return to campus! As Laurentian University sets their sights on the 2021 - 2022 academic year, they are planning a number of transition events for their first-year students which they are hoping to share with the graduating cohorts

On Tuesday, June 15th, 2021 at 7:00pm, Guidance Counsellors, parents, guardians, and students are invited to an information session covering: the creation of the myLaurentian student portal, course planning and registration clinics, previews of Summer Student Success Seminars, and overviews of the 2021 Fall Orientation schedule. Registration is as simple as a return message to Jason-Scott Benoit at [jg\\_benoit@laurentian.ca](mailto:jg_benoit@laurentian.ca). This presentation will be approximately 45 to 60 minutes followed by an optional Q&A session, which will be roughly 30 minutes in length.

## Rainbow District School Board Summer School

Registrations for Summer School are now being accepted. The program will include 3 unique opportunities for students including credit recovery and upgrading, summer cooperative education, and new credits via eLearning.

### Credit Recovery and Upgrading

These courses will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary, Adult Day School. Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions.

### Summer Cooperative Education

Students who are interested in completing an in-person or virtual cooperative education this summer are asked to complete the Google Form that is located in Lockerby Composite's Student Services Classroom. It is important to complete the proper form as there are 2 separate forms - one for students with a placement and another form for those who wish to complete a virtual summer cooperative credit.

### New Credits

Students will also have an opportunity to earn new credits this summer. These credits will be completed through an eLearning or virtual environment. A list of the summer courses can be found in the Student Services Google Classroom as well on the subsequent newsletter pages. Additionally, students must complete the Google Form which is found on the Student Services Google Classroom.

Courses will run based on sufficient enrolment so please ensure you register as soon as possible. For more information please visit the Student Services Google Classroom.



# RDSB Summer Learning Program

- ★ Register by June 25 through your school guidance counsellor.
- ★ Courses run from July 5 - August 4.
- ★ Courses will run subject to sufficient enrolment and teacher availability.
- ★ Students can only register to complete *one* new credit course.
- ★ Students must be available to attend the full duration of the course to meet curriculum expectations. Timelines and due dates will not be adjusted to accommodate vacations.

## New Credit e-Learning Courses

Students should expect to spend approximately 5 hours a day working in their course.

Each course is facilitated by a teacher who controls the timing of the course to encourage collaboration and enable effective feedback. Students do not work through the course at their own speed.

## Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary, Adult Day School and are open to all students from both public and separate schools.

During the first seven days of the program, period 1 classes will run from 8 am to 10:30 am and period 2 classes from 10:45 am to 1:15 pm. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School and run from 8:30 am to 10:30 am and 10:45 am to 12:45 pm.

**Note:** Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions. If the courses pivot to virtual learning then students will work 2.5 hours per day in a combination of synchronous (online video chat together as a group) and asynchronous (independently with teacher support) learning that will be determined by the teacher and communicated to the students

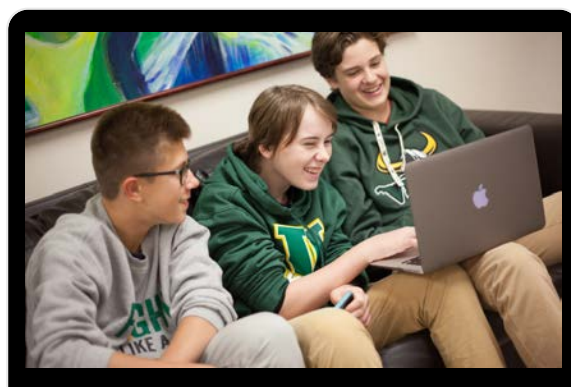
