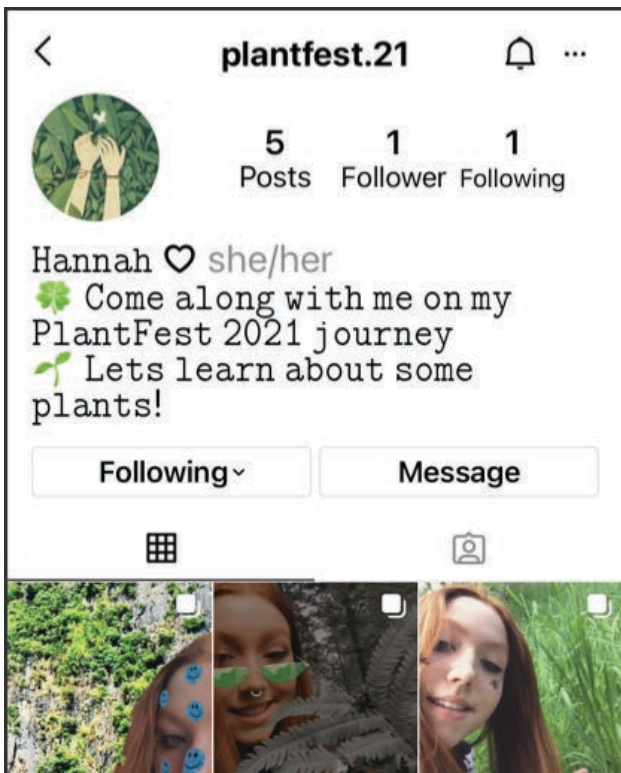

## PLANTFEST 2021

Music festivals might be on hold, but the festival everyone is talking about has already happened! That's right Vikings, Plantfest 2021, a celebration of plant diversity, has taken Lockerby's Biology classes by storm! Student biologists got outside and identified various plants down to the genus, and sometimes even species level. They classified their observations, and then researched the importance of these organisms to humans and the environment. Students were able to choose how to feature their plants, and Hannah D. created a special Plantfest 2021 Instagram account where she featured her specimens, and described their significance - way to go Viking Botanists!



## HEALTH CARE - MEDICAL TECHNOLOGIES

This week, our Health Care students were given an opportunity to work with Terena Scott, who is a nurse at Health Sciences North's Emergency Services. Terena spoke with students about her education pathway, reasons for why she chose nursing as a profession, and how COVID-19 has affected her job.

Likewise, as part of the health care employment exploration components of our Medical Technologies course, our Vikings also met two registered nurses. As part of the discussions, student reviewed bloodwork and reviewed blood reports. Our guest speakers also took the time to analyze ultrasounds and communications with the doctor.



## REMOTE LEARNING UPDATE

Please note that remote learning will continue for the remainder of the school year. Earlier this week, the Premier of Ontario announced that the government is planning for the reopening of schools for the 2021 – 2022 school year. Rainbow District School Board has advised us that measures to limit the spread of COVID-19 will continue as students 12 and up and their families will have an opportunity to be vaccinated. Public Health Sudbury and Districts is working with all of the local school boards to offer first doses at specially designated clinics in Sudbury, Espanola, and Manitoulin in the next few weeks, with second doses being scheduled for August before our next school year. More information about the clinics, including dates, times, and transportation, will be shared with the Viking Community soon (a letter has been shared in this Newsletter). Additionally, we will be providing guidance on the collection and drop-off of student materials at our school with guidance from Public Health Sudbury. Please stay tuned for that information.

There are still many questions remaining and we're working on getting those answers as quickly as possible. As always, we will keep everyone updated as new information and instructions become available. Having said that, a reminder that daily teachings, assessments, assignments, and work - that is being prepared and delivered by teachers - continues. It is our expectation that all Vikings attend all of their lessons and that they complete all of their assigned work. It is also our expectation that all of our students will continue to meet timelines, commitments and due dates in each of your classes. As you know, culminating activities will begin to be assigned next Monday, and the Monday after, with courses wrapping-up on June 21st and June 22nd. We know that these past few months have been tough for everyone and there will still be some challenges ahead in the next few weeks. But Vikings, continue to keep up the great work and continue to do your best to stay positive and healthy.

Dear parent/guardian/member of our school community:

Re: Youth and family clinics

We are writing to you to highlight the important COVID-19 vaccination clinics specially organized for your youth aged 12 and up at time of immunization and family members. As the Medical Officer of Health for Public Health Sudbury & Districts and as the area Directors of Education, we are very excited to know that youth and families in our school communities will soon be protected against COVID-19.

The special vaccination clinics are being organized over three weeks beginning the week of June 7 and are part of the provincial government's plan to ensure all youth aged 12 and up at time of immunization receive two doses of COVID-19 vaccine before the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year. These clinics are made possible through the collaboration of Public Health, area School Boards, First Nation communities and urban Indigenous partners.

The vaccine is critical to [protecting youth](#) and our communities from COVID-19. We know that youth can get infected and spread the virus to others, even if they don't show symptoms. The vaccine is very effective in preventing illness from COVID-19 and keeping our communities safe and healthy. We strongly endorse and encourage participation in the vaccination program.

Throughout the City of Greater Sudbury and districts of Sudbury and Manitoulin, we are planning for youth clinics regardless of whether students are learning remotely or in-person. More details about accessing clinics will be shared shortly, however, there will be daytime clinics and evening clinics. Daytime school clinics will be organized through school-based appointment blocks or through booking into local mass clinics. School-based appointment blocks will have an opportunity for free bus transportation to and from clinics. More details to come on this free daytime transportation. The evening clinics are for youth and families who cannot attend during the day. Bookings at mass immunization clinics will require individuals to arrange their own transportation.

#### What is your favourite memory as a Viking teacher?

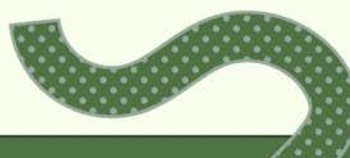

## Grade 12 Students

### Financial Assistance

Once students have decided on the postsecondary college, or university they want to attend, they can then apply for OSAP (if desired). ## Parent/Guardian Workshops

### OSAP Information - Hosted by Collège Boreal

Collège Boréal is offering a number of webinars (in French and English) in the next few weeks for college and university bound students as well as their parents interested in learning more about OSAP and how to apply. ## Rainbow District School Board Summer School

Registrations for Summer School are now being accepted. The program will include 3 unique opportunities for students including credit recovery and upgrading, summer cooperative education, and new credits via eLearning.

### Credit Recovery and Upgrading

These courses will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary, Adult Day School. Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions.

### Summer Cooperative Education

Students who are interested in completing an in-person or virtual cooperative education this summer are asked to complete the Google Form that is located in Lockerby Composite's Student Services Classroom. It is important to complete the proper form as there are 2 separate forms - one for students with a placement and another form for those who wish to complete a virtual summer cooperative credit.

### New Credits

Students will also have an opportunity to earn new credits this summer. These credits will be completed through an eLearning or virtual environment. A list of the summer courses can be found in the Student Services Google Classroom as well on the subsequent newsletter pages. Additionally, students must complete the Google Form which is found on the Student Services Google Classroom.

Courses will run based on sufficient enrolment so please ensure you register as soon as possible. For more information please visit the Student Services Google Classroom.





# RDSB Summer Learning Program

- ★ Register by June 25 through your school guidance counsellor.
- ★ Courses run from July 5 - August 4.
- ★ Courses will run subject to sufficient enrolment and teacher availability.
- ★ Students can only register to complete *one* new credit course.
- ★ Students must be available to attend the full duration of the course to meet curriculum expectations. Timelines and due dates will not be adjusted to accommodate vacations.

## New Credit e-Learning Courses

Students should expect to spend approximately 5 hours a day working in their course.

Each course is facilitated by a teacher who controls the timing of the course to encourage collaboration and enable effective feedback. Students do not work through the course at their own speed.

## Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary, Adult Day School and are open to all students from both public and separate schools.

During the first seven days of the program, period 1 classes will run from 8 am to 10:30 am and period 2 classes from 10:45 am to 1:15 pm. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School and run from 8:30 am to 10:30 am and 10:45 am to 12:45 pm.

**Note:** Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions. If the courses pivot to virtual learning then students will work 2.5 hours per day in a combination of synchronous (online video chat together as a group) and asynchronous (independently with teacher support) learning that will be determined by the teacher and communicated to the students

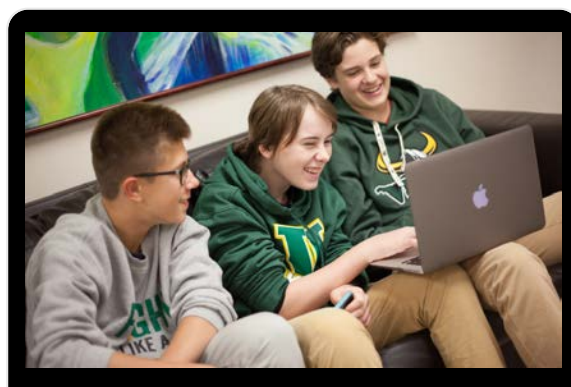
