HISTOIRE AVANT LA PREMIÈRE GUERRE MONDIALE

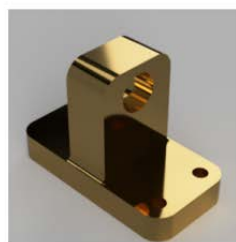

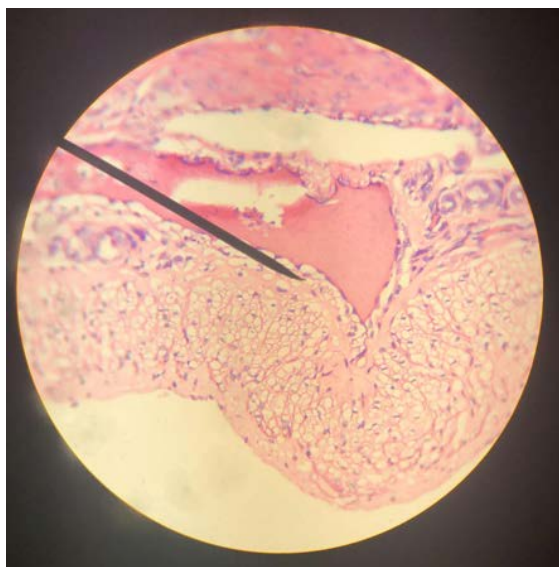

TRAVEL AND TOURISM

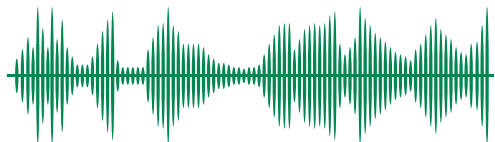

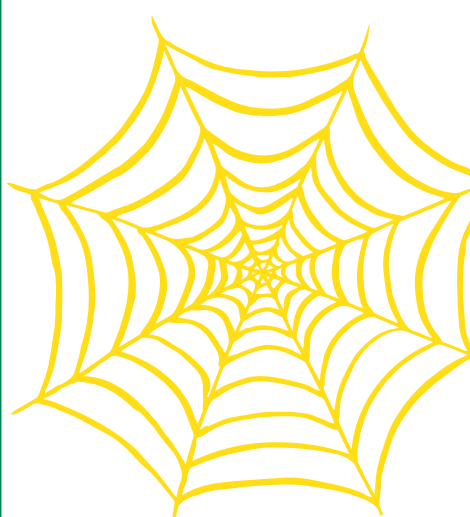
Volleyball

Post Secondary

Visit Lockerby's Class of 2022 Google Classroom to access step-by-step guides as well as other helpful resources. It is important to recognize that COVID-19 has created new realities for post-secondary institutions and by applying early students will be able to have the best chances for success. There are four ways to stay on track of your post-secondary applications:

1. Attend Fall Virtual Open Houses

These events offer an in-depth look at programs, scholarships, admission steps and experiential learning opportunities. Students are able to watch live presentations, talk with professors, representatives, and current students. Visit the individual school's website for more information.

2. Book One-on-One Meetings With Post-Secondary Institution

Students can book a one-on-one virtual meeting with liaison officers to ask questions and get information tailored to their individual needs. Details can be found on individual post-secondary websites.

3. Access Virtual Campus Tours

Many post-secondary institutions' websites have 360-degree virtual reality videos that provide access to research labs, sports facilities, and housing.

4. Complete Your Post-Secondary Application

University Applications

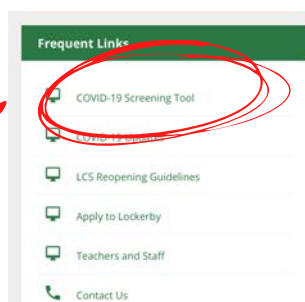
Student Services will be distributing personal identification numbers (PINs) as soon as they are made available by the Ontario University Application Service (OUAS). They are expected to arrive by the end of November. Students can begin the application process once they receive their individual numbers.

House of commons Page Program - Applications due Sunday, November 7th, 2021

Join the House of Commons Page Program and work at the heart of Canada's democracy with students from across the country. Each year, 40 bilingual students graduating from high schools and CEGEPs from across Canada are recruited to participate in the House of Commons Page Program. Pages work directly on the floor of the House of Commons and are responsible for a wide range of tasks related to Chamber activities. This provides them with the opportunity to broaden their knowledge of Parliament by playing a role in the rich traditions of the Canadian parliamentary system. To be selected, candidates must be starting full-time or part-time post-secondary studies in September 2022 at the University of Ottawa, Carleton University, Saint Paul University, Université du Québec en Outaouais, or with their new institutional partners La Cité or Algonquin College. Successful candidates will be required to reside in the National Capital Region during their year of employment as a Page. Visit their website (ourcommons.ca/page) to learn more.

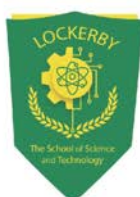

RE: PROGRESS REPORTS AND PARENT/GUARDIAN-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

As we move into our second month of the school year, Lockerby Composite School would like to take the time to provide you with information regarding the distribution of subject Progress Reports and Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews.

Please be advised that **Progress Reports for all Week 1 classes will be distributed between October 7th – 8th, 2021** and **Progress Reports for all Week 2 classes will be distributed to students between October 14th – 15th, 2021.**

Subsequently, all Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews will be occurring virtually on Thursday, October 21st, 2021 from 3:00pm – 6:00pm (through either Google Meets or telephone calls). In order to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be required to visit our school website (lockerby.rainbowschools.ca) and click on the sign-up link in our banner as well as in our 'Frequent Links' section. The sign-up link will be available from October 14th – October 18th, 2021. When visiting our website to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be asked to follow these steps:

1. Have the names of your student's teachers ready;
2. Use the tabs at the top of the sign-up page to locate each teacher that you wish to meet and click on the appropriate teacher tab;
3. Within each teacher tab, you will be asked to select an available time (if there aren't any times that work for you, or if you require a lengthier discussion, parents/guardians are asked to please contact their student's teacher to setup an alternate meeting). **Having said that, please note that interviews will not be 10 minutes in length (as indicated in each tab), as teachers will need a few minutes to prepare/contact their next appointment;**
4. Parents/guardians will then be asked to supply both an email address and a telephone number, as the interviews themselves will be conducted either by (1) a Google Meet (a follow-up email will be sent with the Google Meet code); (2) a telephone call (a follow-up email may or may not be sent); or (3) an email exchange;
5. Ultimately, the information that is provided during this sign-up process will be used by teachers to connect with parents/guardians during the assigned time (eg. emails for Google Meets and email exchanges; phone numbers for calls);
6. To accommodate as many parents as possible, we have created 10-minute time slots and we are asking that both parties to stick to the times allotted as much as possible. **Again, please note that interviews will not be 10 minutes in length (as indicated in each tab), as teachers will need a few minutes to prepare/contact their next appointment.**

As always, thank you for your ongoing support, and we look forward to connecting with you.

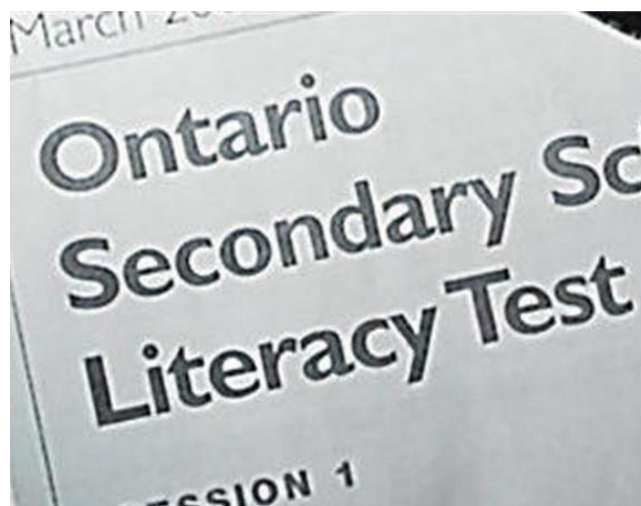

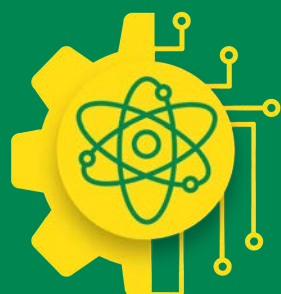
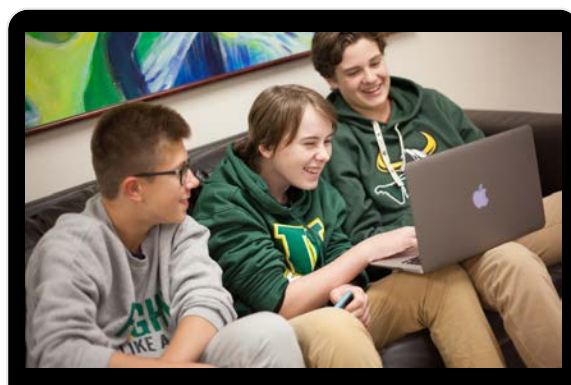
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
