MODEL MAKING



DESIGN - BUILD - DELIVER

Mr. Coulas' Grade 11 Technological Design students spent some time this semester learning to design, plan, and build a bird nest box or bird feeder. The project involved developing ideas and ultimately making a detailed design using 3D modeling software (i.e. Sketchup). Using their individual designs students carried out the construction of the project and delivered construction packages with instructions to St. Joseph's Continuing Care Facility. These projects are used in their programming to engage clients with hands-on projects to help maintain fine motor skills during their recovery. The projects are assembled, sanded, and finished to make them look great. In June, the finished projects will be sold in a silent auction to raise funds for other programming initiatives.





LCS CHOIR



This week in intramural action, the Handlers and team Beausoleil came out on top, and will both advance to the finals!




<u>Boys Hockey</u>

To be considered for this first-round of offers, students must complete and pay for their application prior to the December Break.

Lockerby Vike Wear


