
MASKED DJ (WEEK 7)

Midterm Mark Transmission to Colleges and Universities

Finalizing Application to Post-Secondary

Many of our students have completed and paid for their applications to post-secondary institutions. This message is a reminder that the applications have specific deadlines; it is essential for students to meet these deadlines in order to be considered for their chosen program. It is also important to note that the institutions will not receive any information until applications have been paid

Early conditional offers are starting to be provided to our students. To be considered for this first-round of offers, students must complete and pay for their application prior to the Christmas Break.


Book Your Graduation Pictures Session

Dear parent or guardian:

Re: Stay home and seek testing at the first sign of a COVID-19 symptom, even a mild one

In response to the rapid rise of COVID-19 cases counts in Greater Sudbury, we want to reassure you that the safety of your child(ren) is one of our top priorities. Public Health Sudbury & Districts is monitoring the community-wide spread of COVID-19 closely. COVID-19 and the more transmissible variants of concern have certainly added new challenges to our everyday lives.

Considering this, we would first like to express appreciation for all the superhero parents and guardians whose everyday actions help protect our schools so that children can continue to have in-person learning.

As we navigate through this time together, you may have questions about your role in the COVID-19 response to keep in-person learning safe and reduce local spread. Many of you may be specifically wondering what you should do if their child develops symptoms.

At this time, regardless of vaccination status, we recommend that students check for symptoms daily before heading to the bus stop or school. Although some mild symptoms such as the sniffles are not listed on the provincial COVID-19 school and child care screening tool, due to the rapid rise of cases in Greater Sudbury it is recommended that your child stay home and get tested if they have a symptom, even a mild one.

It is very important that your child does not attend school or take school transportation if they have a COVID-19 symptom, even a mild one. At the first sign of feeling unwell, your child must stay home and get tested. The longer you wait, the more people they could infect. Getting tested as soon as possible also lets Public Health start the contact tracing process sooner if their test result is positive.

While your child awaits a testing appointment or testing results for COVID-19, they must remain in isolation at home and cannot attend school or child care. The Assessment Center will provide guidance if siblings and other close contacts, such as people living in the same household are required to isolate at home while waiting for your child's test results.

Re: Student Rapid Antigen Screening

Given the local surge in cases and with the holiday season fast approaching, Public Health Sudbury & Districts, in collaboration with local school boards, is taking additional action to help slow the spread of COVID-19 and further protect in-person learning.

We are pleased to offer take-home rapid antigen screening kits for students at your child's school. As teens with COVID-19 infection are often not symptomatic, this screening is an additional tool to help minimize risk of outbreaks and potential closures. Increased testing can make it easier to track and prevent the spread of the virus in schools by helping to identify asymptomatic cases early.

All eligible secondary students (Grades 9-12) will have the opportunity to request 1 kit from their school, which includes a total of 5 rapid antigen tests. Please note that your child's participation in this rapid antigen screening is **voluntary**. Students are not required to participate in order to attend school.

Please read the following information carefully.

When to Use a Take-home Rapid Antigen Screening Kit

The use of rapid antigen testing is only recommended for the following students who:

- are not fully vaccinated¹;
- have no symptoms of COVID-19;
- have not been identified as a high-risk close contact to a confirmed case of COVID-19;
- have not been a confirmed case of COVID-19² within the last 90 days.

- vaccines; OR
- One or two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada, followed by one dose of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine authorized by Health Canada; OR
 Three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada

² An individual is considered previously positive if they tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 90 days and have since been cleared from their infection.

Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19, even mild ones, or who are identified as high-risk close contacts should continue to seek a PCR test. A rapid antigen test cannot be used if individuals are isolating due to an exposure to a confirmed case of COVID-19. Rapid testing is not recommended for those who are fully vaccinated¹, as the likelihood of COVID-19 is low in this group, and this could result in an increase of false positive results.

Using the take-home rapid antigen screening kit

Please follow the <u>instructions</u> provided in the take-home kit. A general instructional <u>video</u> on how to perform the rapid test at home can also be viewed by parents and students alike.

Students participating are to test:

- starting immediately, the day after the kit is received
- at home prior to attending school or taking the bus
- consistently twice a week (at least three days between tests), over a period of 2.5 weeks. For example, students may choose to test on Monday and Thursday, Tuesday and Friday, or Wednesday and Saturday.

What to do after the test

You will know the results of your child's test within 15 minutes.

- If the test is negative, your child may attend school as usual.
- If the result is positive, your child will need a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible. Your child must self-isolate and stay home from school until they receive their test results.

Rapid antigen testing is one additional tool that we can use to limit the spread of COVID-19, but it's important to remember that a negative test does not replace other public health measures. It's important that your child continue with wearing a well-fitted mask, staying within their cohort, completing daily symptom screening before going to school or getting on the bus, and getting <u>vaccinated</u> when they become eligible.

The Ministry of Education will also be implementing a *Winter Break Rapid Antigen Testing* program, where additional rapid tests will be sent home for students to use over the winter break. More information will be sent home at that time.


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
