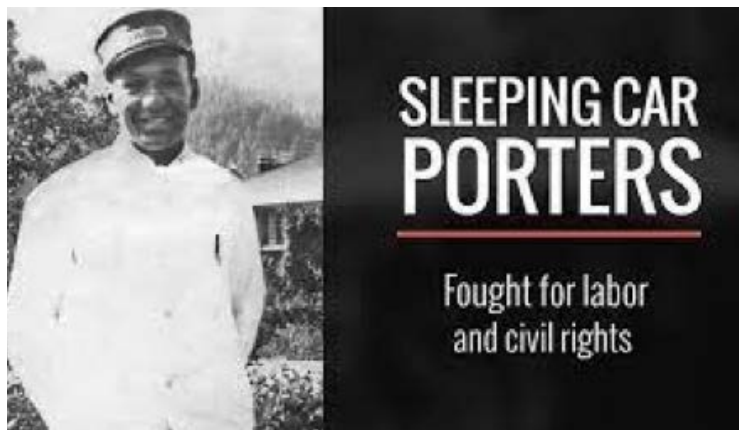
OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES CLASS

Curling

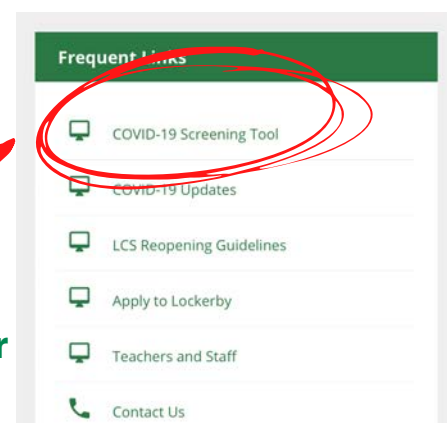
Last week, our Curling Team took to the ice, but unfortunately suffered a loss against Sacred Heart High School.

Course Selection (2022 - 2023)

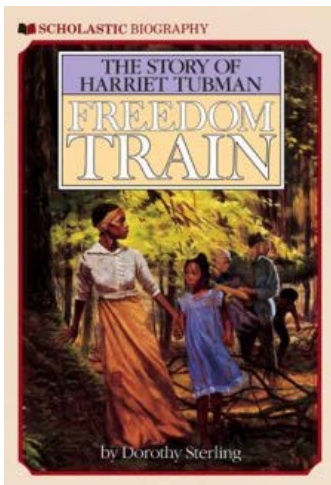
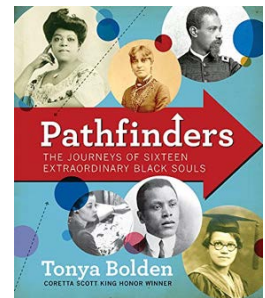
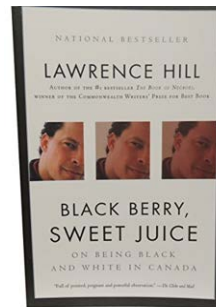
