DNA EXTRACTION

As an introduction to the genetics unit, students followed a series of steps to extract DNA from fruit. Our Viking biologists explained the role of various reagents that they used by relating their function to cellular components. For example, they explained that the meat tenderizer they used contains enzymes which digest the proteins (known as histones) that hold DNA together in the chromosome. In this image students are heating their DNA sample to help unravel the strands!

AP PSYCHOLOGY - COW EYEBALLS

This week, our AP Psychology students spent some time learning about visual sensation and perception. As part of their studies, they looked at the anatomy and physiological structures of the eye by completing a cow eyeball dissection!




ACHIEVING BALANCE



Post-Secondary Application Deadlines

Marks were sent to Ontario colleges and universities on Wednesday, February 9th, 2022. Students are asked to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts to ensure that all of their courses and marks have been transferred. Students should also be checking their individual post-secondary portals (i.e., Cambrian College and/or Laurentian University).




OSSLT UPDATE
