- 2. Click the search button near the top, right-hand corner of the homepage
- 3. Type "Lockerby" and press enter
- 4. Scroll down and click, "Lockerby Kids Caring for Kids Cancer Drive: Remembering Laura Cotesta"
- 5. Enter the amount you wish to donate and fill in the required fields asking for how you will be paying, and the required demographic information
- 6. Click the green "Donate Now" button at the bottom of the page





GRADE 10 VISUAL ART














THE MOLE

My favourite type of food is pizza.



APCapstone

On Thursday, June 9th, 2022, Lockerby Composite School will be hosting its 63rd convocation ceremony at Laurentian University's Fraser Auditorium.

Home to the Science Technology This year, due to a smaller venue, each graduate will receive five tickets for their guests to attend. Doors will open at 5:00 pm.

Education Program (STEP) est. 1984 The convocation ceremony will start promptly at 6:00 pm but we ask graduates to be at the Fraser Auditorium, at Laurentian University, no later than 5:15 pm.

The rehearsal for the convocation ceremony will take place the day of the ceremony on June 9th, 2022 at the Fraser Auditorium. A bus will be provided for the students in the morning. Rehearsal starts at 9:00 a.m.

A graduation gown, cap, and v-stole will be required by the graduates for our convocation ceremony. Students must rent their graduation gowns through our School Cash Online System. There will be a \$45.00 fee. Orders must be placed by Friday, April 29th, 2022 to ensure sufficient time for processing.

The gowns are tentatively scheduled to arrive from Winnipeg the week of May 30th, 2022. Students will be able to pick up their gowns from our school's library. The gowns must be returned **immediately** following the convocation ceremony. If students fail to return their gowns at that time, it will become their responsibility to return the gowns to the distributor incurring a possible fine of up to \$100.00.

On Friday, June 10th, 2022 the graduation prom will occur at Science North's Vale Cavern. The tickets will go on sale on May 2nd, 2022 through our School Cash Online System. Tickets will be \$75.00 for early purchasers and \$80.00 after May 20th, 2022.

The convocation ceremony and graduation prom are the only school events that are sanctioned by the school.

Students must remember that other than the rehearsal, classes will run as scheduled during graduation week. It is important that students remain diligent with their academic responsibilities during this week and in the weeks following graduation. Students are also reminded to stay safe during this graduation week.

Graduates are asked to come to Student Services if they have questions.



The Rainbow District School Board will be sending marks to colleges (OCAS) and universities (OUAC) beginning Friday April 22nd, 2022. Students should review the transmission carefully to ensure the details are accurate. Special attention should be taken with regards to course codes and midterm marks. If there are any errors or questions please email Mrs. Beaudry. Students are also reminded that they must accept an offer to their chosen program carefully. The acceptance procedure is a multi-step process and must be completed with care. Each website has very specific instructions that must be followed. Students are encouraged to read the guidelines with care as well as watch training videos.

College applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by May 1st, 2022. This deadline includes students who are planning to attend the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Programs. University applicants should take note of the June 1st, 2022 date. 
