- 2. Click the search button near the top, right-hand corner of the homepage
- 3. Type "Lockerby" and press enter
- 4. Scroll down and click, "Lockerby Kids Caring for Kids Cancer Drive: Remembering Laura Cotesta"
- 5. Enter the amount you wish to donate and fill in the required fields asking for how you will be paying, and the required demographic information
- 6. Click the green "Donate Now" button at the bottom of the page

SUDBURY MUSIC FESTIVAL

This week, both of Lockerby Composite School's bands received a virtual adjudication for their Sudbury Music Festival submissions from Garry Page, an award-winning music educator with Honours in Music degrees in Trumpet Performance, Academics, and Teaching from the Birmingham Conservatoire of Music and the Guildhall School of Music and Drama.

Our Junior Band received a score of 84, a silver award, only one point away from a gold which needs a minimum score of 85. Some feedback they were given on their performances was to include some more focus on dynamics, work on air support, and generally be more confident in their abilities. Our Senior band scored a 90, a diamond award, which was the highest score Mr. Page had awarded any of the groups in the festival so far! They may even be presented with another achievement during the award ceremony. Some feedback they received included focusing a little more on articulation, the balance of instrument volume in a few and sections, improving air support, particularly in the slow sections.








STEP CHEMISTRY





Post-Secondary Information

Accepting Your College Program - May 1st, 2022

Students are reminded to login to their Ontario College Application (OCAS) to finalize and accept their college offer. Visit https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/

University Responses

As of Friday, May 27th, 2022, every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either (1) an offer, (2) a refusal, or (3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information.

By Wednesday, June 1st, 2022, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence are part of the offer of admission. Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. Students are encouraged to complete the following steps very carefully- it is a multi-step process:

1. Go to https://www.ouac.on.ca/

- 2.Log in to your application using your OUAC profile username and password
- 3. Select the Choices/offers button to view your offer(s) of admission
- 4. Select the Offer or Alternate offer link to respond to your offer
- 5. Select the button to accept the offer, then select 'Save' and continue
- 6. When ready to submit all changes, select Review and submit to complete the process.
- 7. Review and verify your application information
- 8. Carefully read the Applicant's declaration and select I verify and agree if successfully
- 9. submitted, you will receive a confirmation number on the last screen of the submission process

When you successfully complete the submission process, you will immediately receive a confirmation number online. You will also receive the confirmation number by email along with a summary of your responses to offers of admission and/or changes to your application information. After you submit your response to a university offer of admission, you will be locked out of your online application for one business day. After one business day, log back in to your online application to ensure that 'Accepted' is displayed beside the program you accepted. Need Help? ONTARIO LITERACY TEST

Students have been participating in the Wednesday Workshops and accessing resources through the Spring OSSLT 2022 classroom (ii2h2fv) in preparation for writing the literacy test in May. Ms. Baggs is conferencing with all Grade 12 students who are at-risk in their semester 2 credit accumulation and strongly urging them to write the test in May as the graduation requirement is only being waived this year for students who successfully attain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) this term. She has also met with all students who have an identification and sent home a letter outlining their accommodations for the literacy test.


