

CAMERA OBSCURAS!

Ms. Harvey's Grade 9 Exploring Technologies classes experienced a blast from the past this week as they built camera obscuras or what are more commonly known as pinhole cameras! Used for centuries to view solar eclipses or as a drawing aid, these darkened chambers use simple materials to capture scenes. Our Vikings were a little sceptical that their creations made out of either a Pringles can or a cardboard box would work, but they did the experiment and were amazed that the light that enters a tiny hole created by a thumbtack is strong enough to reflect an upside down image of what it is pointed at...science, art, and technology all at once!

CANADIAN COMPUTING CHALLENGE

On Thursday, Lockerby students participated in the University of Waterloo's Canadian Computing Competition (CCC). For this international competition, students get 3 hours to attempt to solve 5 challenging computing problems. Students can opt to take part in the Junior competition or the Senior competition.

This year, a school record of 17 students participated in the competition. Most opted to code using the Java programming language though two students chose to use Python instead. It was a stress-filled but fun day for all. Students that are enrolled in the ICT SHSM program also earned an Experiential Learning activity going towards the completion of their SHSM program.

Impressively, students Mary T. and Brennan G. solved 4 out of the 5 Junior problems finishing as Lockerby's top performers on the Junior competition. Lockerby's top achiever on the Senior competition was Aryan P. who was the only student to earn points on the difficult Symmetric Mountains problem. Excellent work Vikings!

LUNAR CYCLES



Semester 1 Final Report Cards were distributed in Homerooms on Friday, February 17th, 2023.






REDUCING ELECTRICITY

Curling


Our Viking curlers beat Lo-Ellen Park and qualified for the playoffs! They are awaiting the results of the last game to find out who they will play next Wednesday!

Students are asked to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts to ensure that all of their courses and marks have been transferred. Students should also be checking their individual post-secondary portals (i.e., Cambrian College and/or Laurentian University).

Graduation Gowns - February 6th - February 27th, 2023

Students will be able to reserve their graduation gowns starting on February 6th, 2023. The rental fee for each graduate will be \$50.00. Students can reserve their gowns using School Cash Online system.



Course Selection (Grades 9 - 11, returning Grade 12)


Course selections for the 2023 - 2024 academic year will take place beginning on February 13th, 2023. To assist with the planning students are asked to complete their myBlueprint electronic course selection (www.myblueprint.ca). Parents/guardians and students are encouraged to visit the Student Services's Google Classroom for detailed course descriptions and prerequisites (join code: zyxxsi). It is especially important for our present Grade 11 students to do their course selection research because they have to ensure they are picking the proper prerequisites they need for their postsecondary programs. This process of selecting courses can appear intimidating for many students, but counsellors will be working closely with our students to address their questions and concerns. Once students have completed their selection they will receive a hard copy of their choices to review with their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians are asked to please review and sign their student's Course Selection Sign-Off Document. We require the signed document in order to finalize the students' courses for the 2023 - 2024 academic year. If there are any changes that you would like to make, please indicate the changes in pen within the document.
