SUDBURY MUSIC FESTIVAL

This week the Junior and Senior Lockerby Concert Bands participated in the 77th annual Sudbury Music Festival (formerly the Kiwanis Music Festival of Sudbury). The festival was held in person this year, for the first time since before the pandemic. Both bands performed in the Lockerby Auditorium on Monday in front of live adjudicator John Kraus. John Kraus is a member of the Canadian Music Festival Adjudicators Association and the founding director of several orchestras.

Both the Juniors and the Seniors performed well, coming first in their respective categories. The Juniors received Gold with a score of 89, and the Seniors received Diamond with a score of 90! The Juniors performed 'Through the Eye of the Storm' and 'Silverbrook.' Overall, the Juniors were commended for their time changes and accents. The Seniors performed 'Variants On A Shaped Note Tune' and 'Oblivion.' Overall, the Seniors received praise for their attention to the conductor and good dynamic contrast.



They performed in front of a small audience and live adjudicator, Jeffrey McFadden, Head of Guitar Studies and Associate Professor, Teaching Stream, in the Faculty of Music, University of Toronto. In 1992, he was awarded a Silver Medal in the prestigious Guitar Foundation of America Competition. The ensemble came in first for their category and received a Diamond with a score of 90. They performed 'Venezuelan Waltz,' a traditional lively and upbeat tune, composed of five individual guitar parts.








EMERGENCE EXHIBIT


