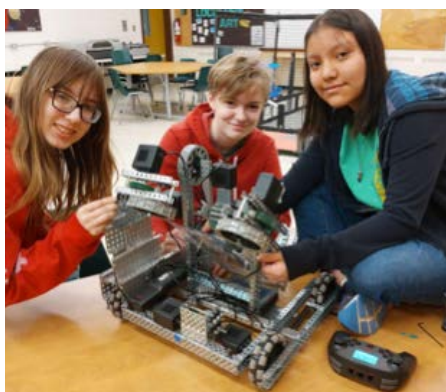
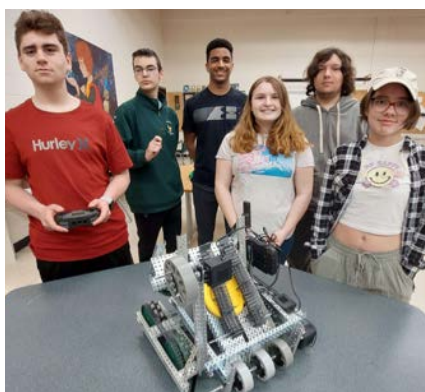

Students were inspired to add endemic plants to a variety of locations around the school, including our existing outdoor classroom planters, along the fence post (looking forward to seeing those asters bloom!), and even in the shade of the cedars beside the school (great spot for enhancement with natural local bunchberry plants). Additionally, to start their Civics course this semester, Mr. Savage's class helped clean-up more than 2,200 pieces of trash in our schoolyard! Your Environmental Council also celebrated with a viewing of the Lorax open to all students at lunch (with some popcorn treats) and made GOOS (Good On One Side) trays for classrooms out of recyclable materials!

### Accepting Your College Program - May 1st, 2023

Students are reminded to login to their Ontario College Application (OCAS) to finalize and accept their college offer. Visit <https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/>

### University Responses

As of May 29th, 2023 every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either 1) an offer, 2) a refusal, or 3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information. By June 1st 2023, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence are part of the offer of admission. Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. Students are encouraged to complete the following steps very carefully- it is a multi-step process:

- Go to <https://www.ouac.on.ca/>
- Log in to your application using your OUAC profile username and password
- Select the Choices/offers button to view your offer(s) of admission
- Select the Offer or Alternate offer link to respond to your offer
- Select the button to accept the offer, then select Save and continue
- When ready to submit all changes, select Review and submit to complete the process.
- Review and verify your application information
- Carefully read the Applicant's declaration and select I verify and agree
- If successfully submitted, a confirmation number will be shown on the last screen of the submission process
- Print the page for reference

When students successfully complete the submission process, they will immediately receive a confirmation number online. They will also receive the confirmation number by email along with a summary of their responses to offers of admission and/or changes to their application information. If students do not immediately receive a confirmation number, their response was not saved. They then must log back into your online application and re-submit their response. After they submit their response to a university offer of admission, students will be locked out of their online application for one business day. After one business day, log back in to the online application to ensure that 'Accepted' is displayed beside the program that was accepted.

## Summer School

### New Credit eLearning Courses



- Online Learning is taught entirely online through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. Online Learning is asynchronous, meaning you learn on your own schedule within a certain time frame.
- A variety of courses are offered through RDSB and the Ontario eLearning Consortium. Please see your guidance counsellor for a complete list.
- Students should expect to spend approximately 5 hours a day working in their course.
- Courses run through other boards might have different start and end dates.

### Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses



- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary Adult Day School and are open to all students from both public and separate schools.
- Schedule:
  - Period 1 - 8:00 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.
  - Period 2 - 10:45 a.m. - 1:15 p.m.

### New Credit Co-op Courses



- July 5 – Aug 3 (1 or 2 Credit), Aug 4 - Aug 25 (additional credit)

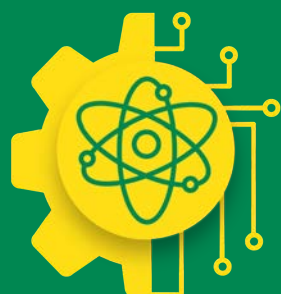
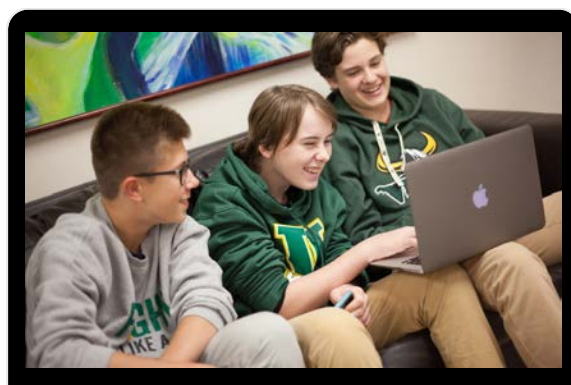
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
