

LOCKERBY STUDENTS AT SKILLS ONTARIO

This past week, six Lockerby students travelled to Toronto to participate in the annual Skills Ontario Competition. They did so as part of Team Sudbury, a partnership with Cambrian College. Skills Ontario has a mandate to inform and engage Ontario youth to the fulfilling world of skilled trades and technologies and hosts over 60 different competitions in a busy day that sees approximately 30,000 spectators visit the competition site. Aspen W. participated in the Lanscaping Design competition and Merisa M., Grace M., Megan M., Jaqueline M., and Xavier V. took part in the Vex Robotics competition.

All students had a great experience during the competition. We all had fun and made a few new friends! Our students were excellent ambassadors for Lockerby during the 3-day trip. Excellent work Vikings!

OJIBWE LANGUAGE

Students participated in creating Faceless Dolls in honour of MMIWG2S (Missing Murdered Indiaenous Women Girls & 2 Spirited). The dolls are a visual representation of the women and girls who need to be remembered as sisters, mothers, aunts, grandmothers, and friends. A grade 8 student was once asked "Why are the dolls faceless?" He replied, "society has stopped looking for them." The project also offers a way for grieving families to find closure.







JOAN MANTLE MUSIC TRUST CONCERT

On Saturday April 29th, Lockerby's Senior Concert Band was invited to be the opening act for the fifteenth annual Joan Mantle Music Trust event, hosted by Sudbury Secondary School. They played Oblivion by Larry Clark followed by Variants on a Shaped Note Tune by Johnnie Vinson. The audience in attendance, which included many local musicians, were impressed by the musicality of this young group. Also performing that evening were a variety of community groups including the Nickel City Wind Ensemble, the Northern Brass and the Sudbury Youth Jazz ensemble. The Joan Mantle Music Trust has helped raise more than \$250,000 to help replace ageing and damaged instruments in Rainbow Schools.



MUSIC MONDAYS

Following on the heels of the Joan Mantle Music Trust concert, our senior music class, together with groups from Copper Cliff Public School and MacLeod Public School, put on a Music Monday concert in support of the Joan Mantle Music Trust. The Trust has raised more than \$250,000 in its fifteen year history to help replace damaged and ageing instruments in Rainbow Schools. These three groups helped raise over \$350 for the fund. 















FINGERPRINT ANALYSIS

Accept Your Offer of Admission - Thursday, June 1st, 2023

By Thursday, June 1st, 2023, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Please note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence are part of the offer of admission. Students must log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers and it is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. Responses are indicated on the Applicant Status Report under the 'Program Confirmed' column. It is important to understand the steps required to properly submit your response to the OUAC. A video tutorial (https://www.ouac.on.ca/ugrad-tutorials/#respond) for online responses is available on the OUAC website and this video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission.




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
