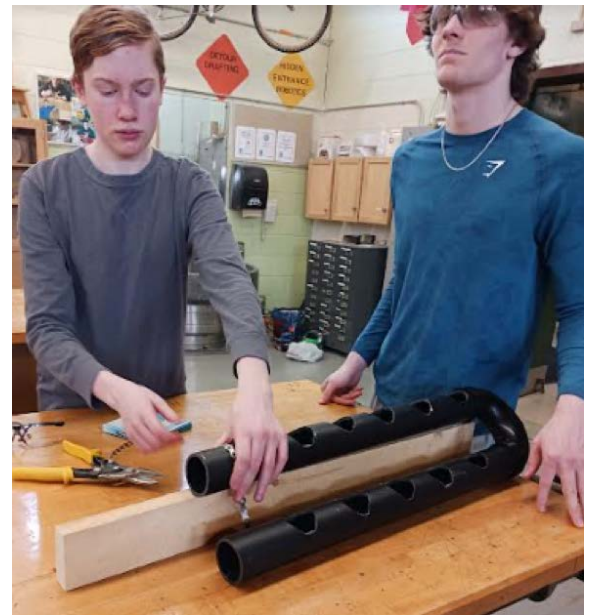

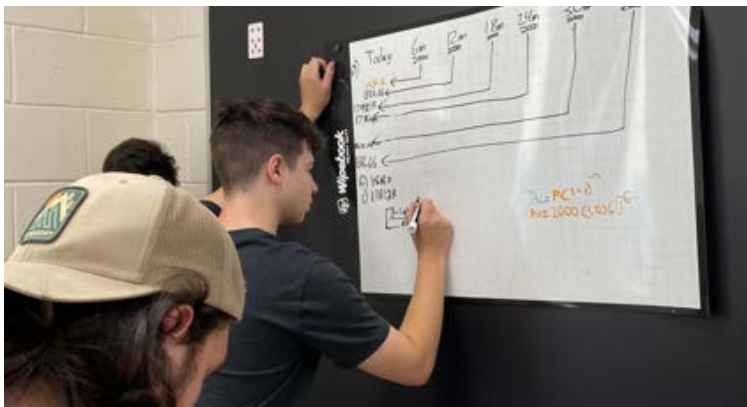
HYDROPONICS

Grade 11 Biology students spent the last several weeks using the engineering design process to construct their own hydroponic systems to grow garden plants. Students researched a variety of builds and then created their systems using scrap lumber, ABS pipe and aquarium pumps. Students had to overcome challenges involving nutrient solutions, water leaks, pipe connections, germination failures, and power outages...needless to say, only a few plants were injured during the making of this project!



AN "INTERESTING" PROBLEM

Grade 11 Mathematics students have been learning about investment options for their future. From their studies, our Vikings have been able to draw time-line diagrams to present ordinary annuities and have been able to consider how changes in interest rates and compounding periods will affect the future and present value of their investments.



ECOSYSTEM OIL SPILL

Grade 9 Science students created their own custom ecosystems to simulate the effect of an oil spill on the environment. Students used a variety of strategies to attempt to clean-up their spills and found that the easiest method was to drain their water bodies, and remove all organic material. Unfortunately this is not a practical solution in the real world and underscores the challenges of dealing with ecological disasters.



ABORIGINAL SECONDARY SCHOOL AWARDS (ASSA)

ASSA celebrations took place on Thursday, June 1st, 2023 at the Caruso Club. This year, over five hundred students received awards between the Rainbow District School Board and the Sudbury Catholic School Board. This annual celebration is founded on principles of partnership with the Indigenous community, teachers, guidance counselors, principals, parents, and the youth. It fosters encouragement, acknowledgement, dignity, integrity, and pride in our youth and was originally created through the partnership of the United Way Centraide North East Ontario and N'Swakamok Native Friendship Centre.

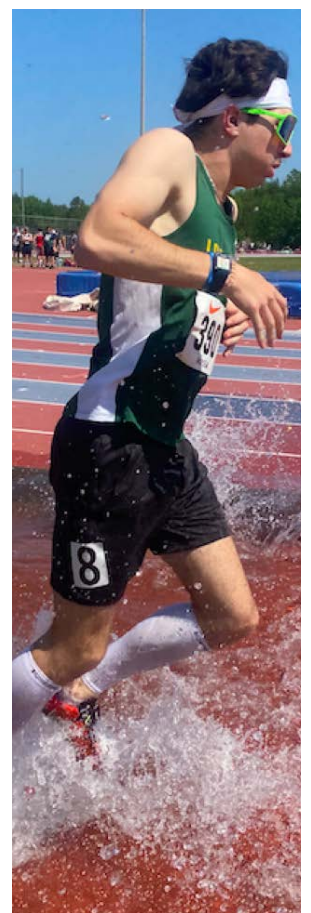
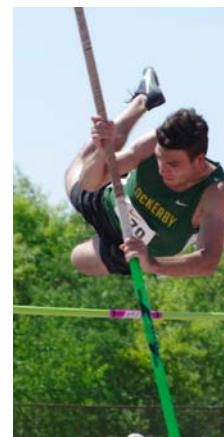
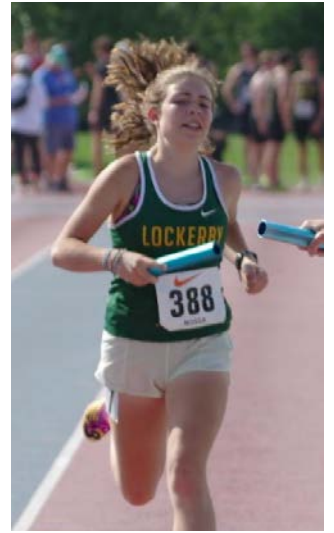
THIS WEEK IN VIKING ATHLETICS...

SUMMER SCHOOL

Registrations for Summer School are now being accepted. Students wishing to enrol in any of the 3 opportunities are asked to complete a Summer School Registration form that can be found in the Student Services Google Classroom and the Student Services office. Completed forms should be submitted to Student Services.

Students will be able to register for one of the three unique opportunities including: (i) credit recovery and upgrading, (ii) summer cooperative education, and (iii) new credits via eLearning.

Credit Recovery and Upgrading

These courses will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School and Adult Day School. Students must have completed the course they are registering for to be eligible to recover or upgrade the course at Summer School.

Summer Cooperative Education

Students who are interested in completing an in-person cooperative education this summer will be able to earn 2 or 3 credits. The program will run for the month of July for students wishing to earn 2 credits and will also include August for the students wishing to earn 3 credits.

New Credits

Students will also have an opportunity to earn new credits this summer. These credits will be completed through an eLearning or virtual environment.

Courses will run based on sufficient enrolment so please ensure you register as soon as possible. For more information please Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry

Students are asked to return their Summer School Application Forms to Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry by June 23rd, 2023, for eLearning & Cooperative Education or June 29th, 2023, for Credit Recovery & Upgrading.

RDSB Summer Learning Program

- ★ Register by through your school guidance counsellor.
- ★ Courses run from July 4 - August 3.
- ★ Courses will run subject to sufficient enrolment and teacher availability.
- ★ Students can only register to complete *one* new credit course.
- ★ Students must be available to attend the full duration of the course to meet curriculum expectations. Timelines and due dates will not be adjusted to accommodate vacations.

New Credit Online (e-Learning) Courses

Students should expect to spend approximately 5 hours a day working in their course.

Each course is facilitated by a teacher who controls the timing of the course to encourage collaboration and enable effective feedback. Students do not work through the course at their own speed.

A variety of courses are offered through RDSB and the Ontario eLearning Consortium. **If you are looking for a course not listed below please see your guidance counsellor for a full list of available courses and to register.**

Note: RDSB courses run from July 5-Aug. 3, however, courses offered through other boards might have different timelines.

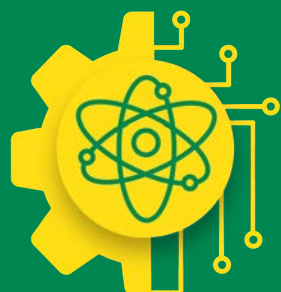
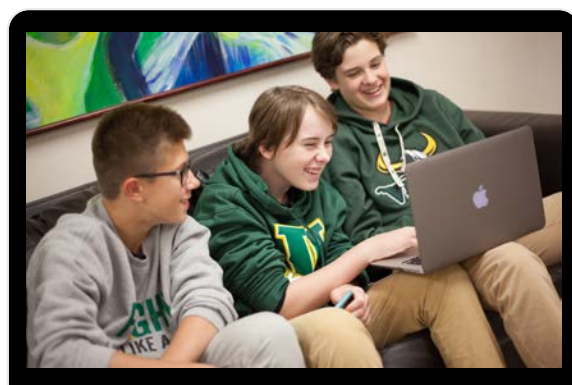
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
