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#### RE: PROGRESS REPORTS AND PARENT/GUARDIAN-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

As we move closer to the second month of first semester, Lockerby Composite School would like to take the time to provide you with information regarding the distribution of subject Progress Reports and Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews. Please be advised that **Progress Reports for all classes will be distributed on Friday, October 13, 2023**.

Subsequently, all Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews will be occurring <u>in-person</u> on Thursday, October 19, 2023 from 3:00pm – 6:00pm. In order to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be required to visit our school website (lockerby.rainbowschools.ca) and click on the sign-up link in our banner as well as in our 'Frequent Links' section. The sign-up link will be available from October 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. When visiting our website to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be asked to follow these steps:

- 1. Have the names of your student's teachers ready;
- Use the tabs at the top of the sign-up page to locate each teacher that you wish to meet and click on the appropriate teacher tab;
- 3. Within each teacher tab, you will be asked to select an available time (if there aren't any times that work for you, or if you require a lengthier discussion, parents/guardians are asked to please contact their student's teacher to setup an alternate meeting). Having said that, please note that interviews will be 5 minutes in length (as indicated in each tab).
- 4. On the evening of Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews, parents/guardians are invited to attend to the school through the Main Entrance. Once in the Main Foyer, there will be students available to assist in navigating the school to get to teacher meeting rooms. Maps of the school and teacher meeting room lists will also be provided.
- 5. A reminder to parents/guardians that the Progress Report is an early estimation of progress, and this initial meeting facilitates further parent/guardian-teacher communication throughout the semester. Again, to accommodate as many parents/guardians as possible, we have created 5-minute timeslots and we are asking that both parties adhere to the times allotted.

The information shared in this letter is also available through our school website. As always, thank you for your ongoing support, and we look forward to connecting with you.

#### OIL DISASTER!

Grade 9 Science students have spent some time studying environmental disasters by creating an aquatic ecosystem and then contaminating it with oil to mimic the 2010 Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill. They discovered which methods worked (and which didn't) for cleaning-up!





#### OIL DISASTER!

This week, Grade 9 Science students also studied physical and chemical changes in their first chemistry laboratory of the year! Potassium lodide and Lead II Nitrate are two colourless solutions, but when mixed together, they combine to make an opaque yellow precipitate! The change in colour and formation of a solid are both indicators of a chemical change!

# LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

The OSSLT is a provincial test of literacy skills that students have acquired by the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the OSSLT is one of the mandatory requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. There are two administration sessions occuring November 2023 and in the Spring of 2024.

Over the next month all eligible writers will be participating in a variety of intensive workshops with their Grade 10 classroom teachers in order to help prepare when they write the test in November. The November test dates will be shared in the coming weeks. In addition to the workshops, students will participate in a literacy diagnostic on Monday, October 16th, 2023 during Periods 3 and 4. Ms. Baggs, will be following-up with students with identifications after the diagnostic in order to finalize accommodations. Accommodation letters will be sent home with the students to share with their parents.
