Whodunit? This week our Grade 11 Law class spent some time investigating the intricacies of our legal systems to solve a murder!






VIKING SCHOLAR (2023 - 2024)



RE: UPCOMING OSSLT EQAO ASSESSMENT 2024 - 2025

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9.

This year, the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) will be offering the online OSSLT to students in Grades 10 and 11 and non-graduating students. Successful completion of this literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

Between Tuesday, November 5 and Tuesday, December 5, 2024, and, Tuesday, March 18, and Tuesday, April 15, 2025, our eligible students will be taking part in the OSSLT.

Students will complete the test in two sessions (Session A and Session B). Each session is designed to be completed between 65 – 75 minutes, and students will complete each session in one sitting. Additional time may be provided for any students who require it. After completing both sessions, students will be presented with a questionnaire that asks them about their experiences, attitudes, and perceptions concerning literacy.

Each student will receive an Individual Student Report after the scoring of the test by EQAO. The school will make these reports available to students.

Students can become familiar with the online test and its accessibility tools through EQAO's online practice test. For more information about EQAO and to view the full practice test, you are encouraged to visit EQAO's website at www.eqao.com.


