# ALPINE SKIING CHAMPIONS!

The Lockerby Alpine Ski team showcased exceptional skill and technique at the NOSSA Regional Championships held in Elliot Lake this past week. Ryder C. was the standout performer, earning gold medals in both the Slalom and Giant Slalom events, securing 1st place for the boys' team and qualifying them for the OFSAA Provincial Championships in Collingwood next week. Other top finishers included Ethan H., in 2nd place, Mac Y., in 3rd, Maks B., in 6th, and Cam Y., in 7th. The combined efforts of Cole T., Parker D., Caleb C., Henry W., and Istvan K. also contributed to the team's victory.

In the Open Division, Quintin T., led his team with a 2nd place finish, followed by Gord F., Toma C., and Ewan D. The team finished 1st overall and will join the high school racers in Collingwood next week. In the girl's division, Avery G., Lockerby's only female racer, carved up the slopes finishing 5th overall. Way to go Vikings and good luck at the OFSAA Provincial Championships!

# **STEP FAIR - 2025**

On Monday, Dr. Pete Whittington (a key researcher from Brandon University and who is part of the Sudbury Peatland Project), visited a group of Grade 9 students who are interested in wetland research. He described sampling methods for determining precipitation, and talked about the challenges of studying varying topography. This was especially helpful to our Vikings who are studying pH changes, metal particles, and pollen in the local wetland. Some students are designing, building and applying their knowledge of coding to produce a precipitation gauge that Dr. Whittington's team would find useful.






# SEMESTER 1 FINAL REPORT CARD



# VALENTINE'S DAY TREAT



#### Nordic Skiing




