
- Honorable mentions at the event went to Jake M., Dominic S., and Dakshatha L.












He played Introduction and Variations on a Theme by Mozart op. 9, receiving a mark of 88 and receiving a Gold Award, Libra Sonatine, where he received a mark of 90, receiving a Diamond Award, and Invocación y Danza, for a mark of 91 and another Diamond Award. Next-up was the newly formed Lockerby Guitar Ensemble. These folks have only been at this for two months, having started the guitar class in February, yet they absolutely dazzled the adjudicator! In fact the adjudicator commented, "this is the best large guitar ensemble I have seen at any festival that I have attended." Their performance received a mark of 90 and a Diamond Award!


