The school climate survey collects information about students' perceptions and experiences of their school as a learning environment, including belonging, safety, mental health and well-being. For Grades 7 to 12, the survey also gathers identity-based data to help schools better understand the communities that they serve. You can access the survey at rainbowschools.ca. Grades 4 to 6 and Grades 7 to 12. To learn more, please read the school climate survey Frequently Asked Questions. Data will be compiled in aggregate form only meaning all student responses taken together, not individual student responses - for each school and for the school board. The Ministry of Education requires school boards in Ontario to complete school climate surveys. The goal is to promote student achievement and well-being, and to foster a positive school climate that is safe, inclusive and accepting of all students. We welcome this opportunity to learn more about the student experience in our schools. The data will inform school planning and programming for student achievement and well-being.

As always, students should arrive early to give themselves adequate time to prepare for writing their examination. Students cannot leave the examination area within one hour of examination start-time.








THIS WEEK IN VIKING ATHLETICS...

Rainbow Schools Summer Learning Program will offer new credit eLearning courses, Co-Op, Credit Recovery, and upgrading courses. Courses will run from July 2 - July 31. New Credit eLearning Courses

- eLearning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. eLearning is asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT
 be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no
 guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
- Students should see their guidance counsellor for a complete list of available courses and to register.

- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary School's Adult Day School and are open to students from both public and separate schools.
