Auto Club


The Lockerby Pit-Crew is already up and running this year in the transportation shop.


Robotics Club

Grade 9 STEP

Only five days into the semester and much has been accomplished by our new grade nine students. STEP students are learning two units concurrently: web design and architectural design. Students have been asked to design a small house using select software. As you can see in the example provided below by Tristin, the results are stunning! Furthermore, they are also creating their online portfolios, which will showcase their work throughout the semester. Using the new Google Sites application, the students will be able to design and develop their own custom sites and learn about the importance of online privacy, security, and creative commons licensing. We're off to a flying start and parents are encouraged to check in on their child's website to admire their progress throughout the semester.



Interior Design

When Monkey was looking for a new bedroom design, he turned to Lockerby's STEP Interior Design class. This week, students were introduced to a variety of clients like Monkey, with the goal of creating the perfect bedroom based on specific design criteria. After some research and drawings, students were challenged to build 1:12 scale models of their bedrooms from foam board. They also constructed 3 pieces of furniture, and decorated the rooms with wall and floor finishes. This activity was a fun opportunity to work one-on-one with a classmate in a creative endeavour. Following their presentations, students photographed their bedrooms, and produced a short video clip to showcase their chosen design style. From the first day of class, each of these STEP students starts to build a Web-based portfolio of their design work throughout the semester.

Whether our students learned French in immersion, or they transferred from a French school, we foster an environment where everyone feels comfortable taking risks and building skills as a second language learner.

LOARN Scholarship

The Loran National Scholarship was founded in 1988 to fund outstanding students to study on Canadian University Campuses. The foundation seeks well-rounded students who demonstrate character, promise of leadership and strong commitment to service in the community. In order to apply to the Direct Pool students must be nominated by their high school.

University of Toronto National Scholarship

The University of Toronto National Scholarship rewards original, creative and committed Canadian secondary school students. These are students who demonstrate superior academic performance, original and creative thought, and exceptional achievement in a broad context. They excel in academic pursuits, demonstrate enthusiasm for intellectual exploration and have a strong involvement in the lives of their schools and communities. Each year approximately ten students are named National Scholars (winners) and ten are named Arbor Scholars (runners-up). In order to apply to the Direct Pool students must be nominated by their high school.

Lockerby's Nominations for LOARN and University of Toronto

Lockerby is able to nominate three students for the LOARN Scholarship and one student for the University of Toronto Scholarship. Students who are interested in being sponsored for either of these prestigious scholarships are asked to complete a Student Activity Form (found on Lockerby's Website). Forms must be submitted to Guidance by Thursday September 20th, 2018 by 12:00 pm.
