The owner of H.E.A.T., Nichelle Thomson, came into our grade 12 health care classroom this week to talk about her career as an athletic therapist and manual osteopath. She also told us that she was studying the ancient Chinese art of acupuncture. She didn't just only teach us about how she got to where she is, and what her next steps will be, she also explained some treatment options for a couple students who were having some pain in their body (ankle, elbow, back, and sinuses). Nichelle's presentation was interactive and she used a skeleton to help describe the natural motion and function of our joints and muscles, and showed us how an injured person's joint is moving atypically. The most important thing that she taught the class was that you couldn't just fix the area where there is pain because there could be an injury somewhere else in the body that contributes to the other injury.

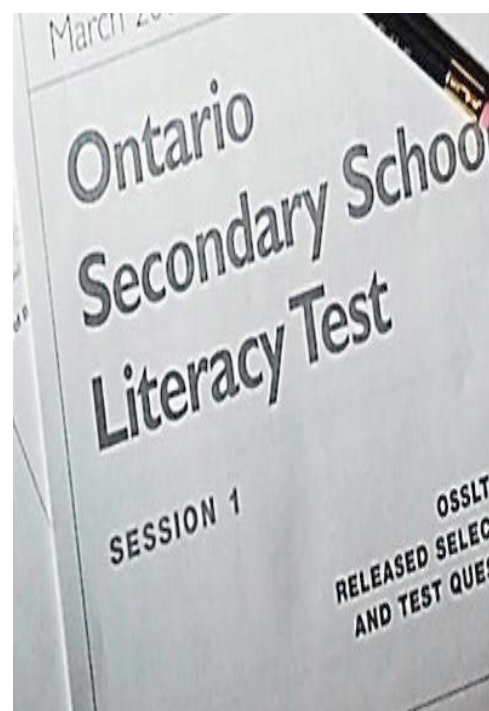


GRADE 10 LITERACY TEST

Each student in Ontario must write the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) as it is a graduation requirement and is written province-wide during Grade 10. The test is based on reading and writing skills from Grade 9. **This year's test is March 27, 2019.** A score of 300 or higher is deemed as successful. If a student is unsuccessful there is the option of taking the Ontario Literacy Course (OLC) at Summer School or taking the course semester 1 at Lockerby. Upon successful completion of the OLC course the student will meet the literacy graduation requirement and also receive a credit.

On Wednesday, October 3, 2018 all grade 10 students will be writing a sample booklet of OSSLT in one of their classes. Lockerby teachers will volunteer their time and mark the practice test and provide feedback to students. The results of the practice will be used to help provide additional supports in preparation for the March 27, 2019 test.
