LOCKERBY'S CULTURAL EXCHANGE TRIP TO CHINA

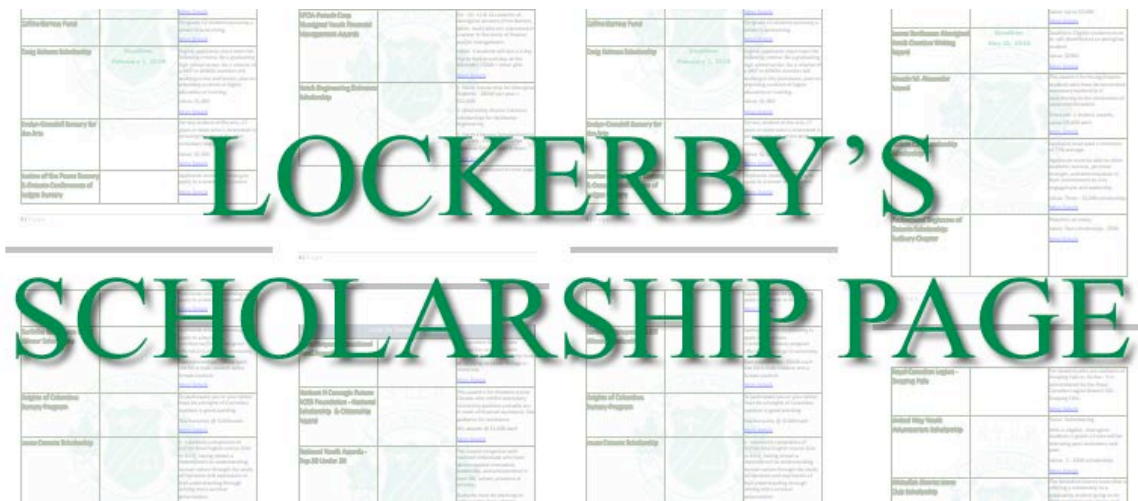

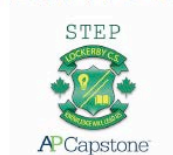

Post-Secondary Applications (College and University)

A number of students have completed their post-secondary applications with Guidance this week. Parents and guardians are encouraged to review the applications with their students this weekend. If your student has any questions/concerns please have them see a Guidance counsellor. Students are reminded that they **must pay the fees** for their post-secondary applications (**the application will not be processed until payment is received**).

Deadline for University Registration: January 16th, 2019

Deadline for College Registration: February 1st, 2019

Review Applications Carefully

Parents and guardians are encouraged to review their student's applications to ensure accuracy. Please review with your student the following details:

- **Admission Requirements**

This detail can be found within the university application portal. Each program will have specific requirements. Information regarding college admission requirements can be found with each institutions view book or on the college website.

- **Campus Location**

Select campus location carefully. Institutions often have several campuses for example - University of Toronto has three campuses - St. George, Mississauga, Scarborough.

- **Supplementary Material**

Several programs require supplementary materials from students. Students may be asked to prepare an essay, complete a profile, or even assessments at the institution. Students are reminded to review specific details for each of their programs. They should contact the institution's admission office if they have any questions or concerns.

- **Review Start-Date**

Post-secondary institutions have **three distinct start dates** - September 2019, January 2020, and May 2020. Ensure your student has selected the appropriate start-date.
