Students will be completing their post-secondary applications with a Guidance counsellor in our library from November 29<sup>th</sup> - December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

The application fees for this year are as follows:

#### College Applications:

\$95.00 (5 choices will be provided with this fee)

#### University Applications:

\$150.00 (3 choices will be provided with this fee; additional choice fee is \$50.00 per selection).

In order to ensure that students are ready for this process, they are encouraged to start to prepare their short list of schools over the next few weeks. There are a number of helpful resources including three online websites:
