Students performed a series of chemical tests to determine the identity of the white powder and calculated the amount of additive in the drug.

WOODWORKING SPOTLIGHT

This semester, the woodshop is buzzing with 44 students enrolled in Construction Technology. In this course students learn how to draw, and use tools and materials to design products out of wood. Grade 11 students Drew and Chad are displaying their hand-made mallets. This project tested their ability to lay out and cut a beautiful mortise and tenon joint. Besides being useful for striking a wood chisel, these tools are also incredibly artful in their design!



Grade 12 construction students are already building a number of larger projects to benefit our community partners. This year we will be building picnic tables, a floating dock and some wood sheds for Camp Manitou, which is a not-for-profit children's camp in The Bay of Islands. Learning how wood should be joined to create a structure is something that construction students often find challenging. In this case, Colby has created a model of a floating dock on a 1/8 scale.


LOCKERBY CHEERLEADING AND BOSTON PIZZA






WHAT'S NEW THE LIBRARY?




