



FROM PIXELS TO PISTONS


For my architecture grade 12 assignment, I chose to gain some skills with a CAD software called Fusion 360. The program allows you to construct designs and see their outcome in a 3D format. As a student interested in mechanics and with a small background in racing, I decided to essentially take my dad's custom pistons and connecting rod from his race car and see if I could recreate them with the program.

The custom pistons I chose are for a high-performance small block chevy, bore/stroke equaling 434 cubic inches. The pistons are known as an 18-degree piston, meaning the valves attack the head of the piston at an 18-degree angle. It is a raised dome piston which allows the compression to be 13:1. The engine with the pistons produces 900 horsepower, and 740-foot pounds of torque. The piston I designed, if manufactured out of metal could potentially fulfil the purpose of these pistons.

I began by designing the connecting rod, then the pin and then moved on to the piston head. The whole process took me about two weeks to complete, I took an additional week to 3D print the piston and adjust to make sure that all the pieces fit together perfectly. When the piston and connecting rod printed, they were smaller compared to the real pistons in the race engine, however, they are a decent representation. I enjoyed the process because it allowed me to gain new experience with Fusion programs and tested my determination to design something with no guide other than what I had in front of me.
