FORENSICS AT LOCKERBY COMPOSITE

This week students in our grade 12 forensics class visited Laurentian University's Department of Forensic Biology. There, students met with forensic experts and worked in one of the University's new laboratories. The class extracted their own DNA and were able to take it with them in a fancy necklace! Then, Dr. Scott Fairgrieve shared some case work with the group, and together they proposed key questions and procedures for examining human remains. Students were able to deduce the manner of death using physical evidence on skeletal remains. This experience was interesting for students pursuing careers in forensics, policing, law, and even kinesiology. 

CANADA WIDE SCIENCE FAIR GOLD MEDALLIST





Exterior \$10,000




Living Room \$10,000






