## ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) RESEARCH COURSE

This past week, AP researchers worked together to create jujube and toothpick sculptures to highlight the importance of observation, attention to detail, collaboration, and communication. A small group created an initial sculpture, a viewer relayed her observations to the messenger, and the messenger provided the details to the builders. Sculptures were compared for accuracy and students discussed the activity's application to their own research process. Our researchers are now in the process of developing topics, writing problem statements, and conducting initial research.

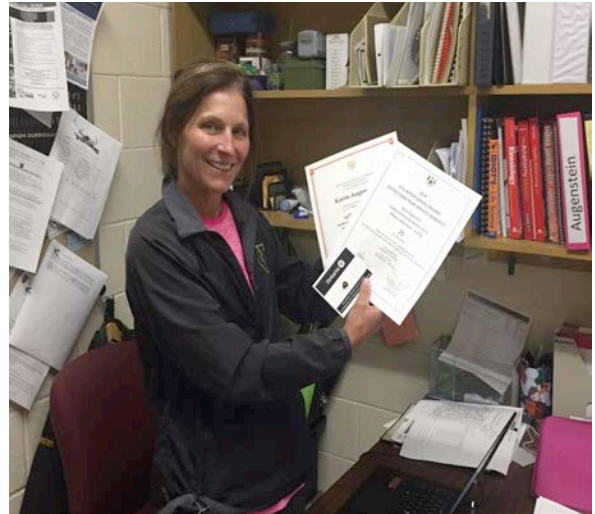

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) SEMINAR COURSE

AP Seminar students were in the STEAM room this past Friday, working on anamorphic drawings that explore the idea of perception, the current theme of the course. Students began by looking at a number of optical illusions and discussed how our brains can be fooled into seeing something that isn't actually there. Students also watched a video that proved that our brains can also miss some pretty obvious things (a man in an ape suit, for example). After discussion and a few examples, students learned how to create their own optical illusions using anamorphic drawing techniques. #### LOARN Scholarship

The Loran National Scholarship was founded in 1988 to fund outstanding students who study on Canadian University Campuses. The foundation seeks well-rounded students who demonstrate character, promise of leadership, and strong commitment to service in the community. In order to apply to the Direct Pool, students must be nominated by their high school. Our school is able to nominate three students for the LOARN Scholarship. Students who are interested in being sponsored for this scholarship are asked to complete a Student Activity Form (found on Lockerby's Website). Forms must then be submitted to Guidance by Friday September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 by 12:00pm.

#### University of Toronto National Scholarship

The University of Toronto National Scholarship rewards original, creative, and committed Canadian secondary school students. These are students who demonstrate superior academic performance, original and creative thought, and exceptional achievement in a broad context. Students will excel in academic pursuits, demonstrate enthusiasm for intellectual exploration, and have a strong involvement in the lives of their schools and communities. Each year approximately ten students are named National Scholars (winners) and ten are named Arbor Scholars (runners-up). In order to apply to the Direct Pool students must be nominated by their high school. Our school is able to nominate one student for the University of Toronto Scholarship. Students who are interested in being sponsored for this scholarship are asked to complete a Student Activity Form (found on Lockerby's Website). Forms must then be submitted to Guidance by Friday September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 by 12:00pm.

### Enrichment

SHAD is Canada's premier summer residential enrichment program for Grade 10, 11, and 12 students focused on STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) and entrepreneurship. The program runs during July across 13 university campuses from UBC to Dalhousie University. 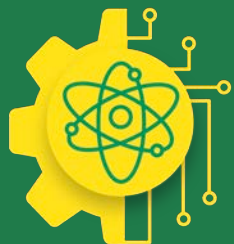
