



#### Post-Secondary Applications

Many of our students have completed and paid for their applications to post-secondary institutions. This message is a reminder that the applications have specific deadlines; it is essential for students to meet these deadlines in order to be considered for their chosen program. **It is also important to note that the institutions will not receive any information until applications have been paid.** Early conditional offers are starting to be provided to our students, and in order to be considered for this first-round of offers, students must complete and pay for their application prior to the Christmas Break.

University: Wednesday, January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 (\$150.00 fee for 3 programs)  
College: Friday, February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 (\$95.00 fee for 5 programs)

#### Graduation Photographs

Graduation photographs will be taking place January 8<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Students schedule an appointment at [prestigeportraits.ca](http://prestigeportraits.ca). Students can also receive additional information and brochures in the Guidance Office.

#### Graduation Gowns

There are only three weeks left for the \$45.00 fee incentive. A number of students have rented their graduation gowns through the Guidance Office. If students are interested in attending our convocation this spring, they are reminded that they must see a Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible to rent their gowns. The fee will increase to \$50 after Christmas Break. Students can also pay for their gowns accessing Cash Online.


