



This week students genetically modified *E. coli* bacteria! This was an opportunity for students to use advanced microbiological techniques and equipment, and the result is pretty cool as well. Students inserted a gene for antibiotic resistance, and fluorescence. That means that successfully modified bacteria will glow in the dark!



PULSES CHALLENGE



This Go Green initiative is part of our ongoing efforts to encourage sustainable practices, increase awareness about global food security, and promote well-being.






A message from Mr. Runciman and Mr. Lafraniere to all students:


