Lockerby Vikings wore orange t-shirts, this past Wednesday, as we recognized the effects and intergenerational impacts of the residential school system on First Nation, Métis, and Inuit children in Canada. Orange Shirt Day began in Williams Lake, British Columbia by the St. Joseph Mission residential school commemoration project. Phyllis Webstad, a young girl from the Dog Creek reserve, attended the Mission in 1973, where her clothes were removed, including her brand new orange shirt. Phyllis' story inspired the Mission to declare September 30th Orange Shirt Day, as this was the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to attend residential schools.




DISCOVERING THE PROPERTIES OF SUBSTANCES




BATTLESHIP GEOGRAPHY




2020 - 2021 KIDS CARING FOR KIDS CANCER DRIVE




