

WOODWORKING - GRADE 9





Post Secondary

There are four ways that our Vikings can stay on track of their post-secondary applications:

- Attend Fall Virtual Open Houses

These events offer an in-depth look at programs, scholarships, admission steps and experiential learning opportunities. Students are able to watch live presentations, talk with professors, representatives, and current students. Visit the individual school's website for more information.

- Book One-on-One Meetings With Post-Secondary Institutions

Students can book a one-on-one virtual meeting with liaison officers to ask questions and get information tailored to their individual needs. Details can be found on individual post-secondary websites.

- Access Virtual Campus Tours

Many post-secondary institutions' websites have 360-degree virtual reality videos that provide access to research labs, sports facilities, and housing.

- Complete Your Post-Secondary Application

Students are encouraged to apply early. Visit Lockerby Composite's Student Services Website to access step-by-step guides as well as other helpful resources. All of our graduates have received their personal identification numbers (PINs) for university applications and students who are wishing to attend college have received a step-by-step guide to apply. It is important to recognize that COVID-19 has created new realities for these institutions and by applying early students will be able to have the best chances for success.



LIBRARY SERVICES


