## NO CELL-FIES ALLOWED...

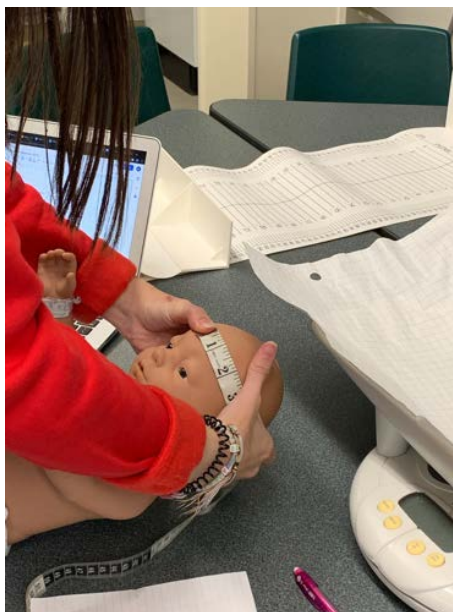
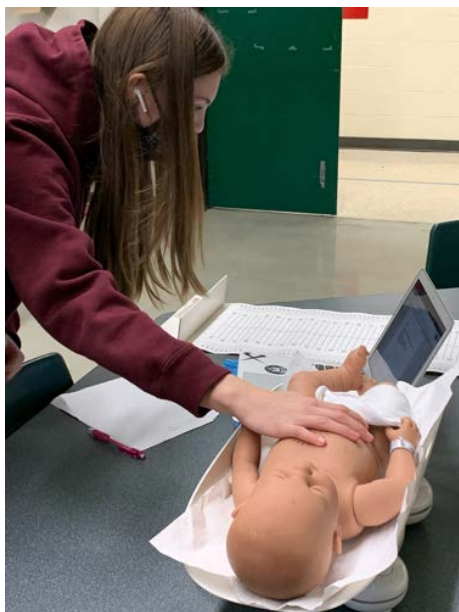

## Post-Secondary Applications

Students are encouraged to complete their post-secondary applications over the next few weeks. Students applying to university require a personal identification number, these envelopes have been distributed to all of our face-to-face learnings. Student who are learning remotely are asked to pick up their envelopes in the main office. College students are reminded that there is a step-by-step guide on Lockerby's Student Services Google Classroom.

## Google Meet for University Applications

Student Services will be hosting a Google Meet on Monday, November 30th, 2020 at 11:00am to provide a step-by-step look at how to apply to university. Students will be able to access the join code on the Students Service Google Classroom. Students are encouraged to have at least 3 university program choices ready for this day as well as their OUAC application letter. Students who have a class during this period will be provided time within the class to participate. If you are a remote learner or have a spare you are encourage to join this very important session from your individual location.

## Preliminary SAT (PSAT)

Student Services will be providing an opportunity for students to complete the College Board's PSAT on Tuesday, January 26th, 2021. Students are asked to email Mrs. Beaudry or Ms. Baggs if they are interested by Monday, November 30, 2020. The school will be charging students \$25.00 per test to cover the costs of the examination. The Preliminary SAT is a practice version of the SAT exam and takes 2 hours and 45 minutes to complete.

Picture Retakes will be held at our school on Thursday, December 3rd, 2020. Pictures will be taken in our Library on that day.

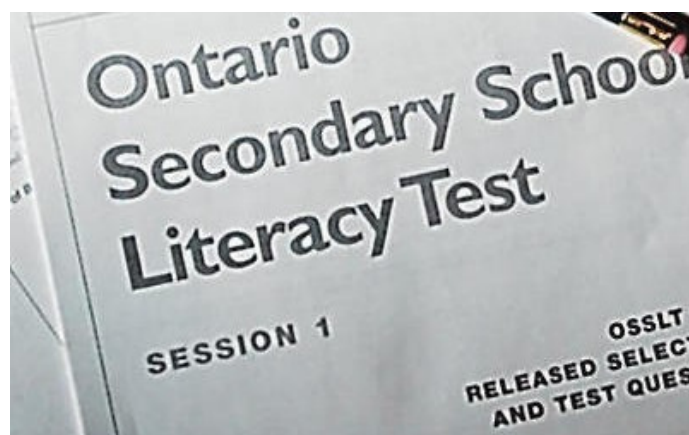

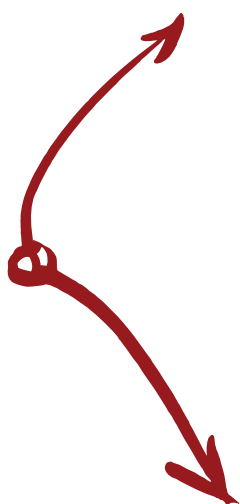


## LIBRARY SERVICES

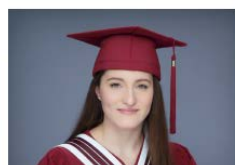

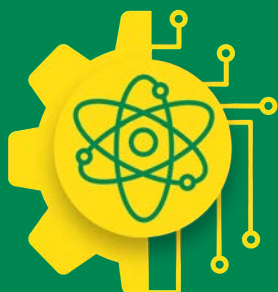
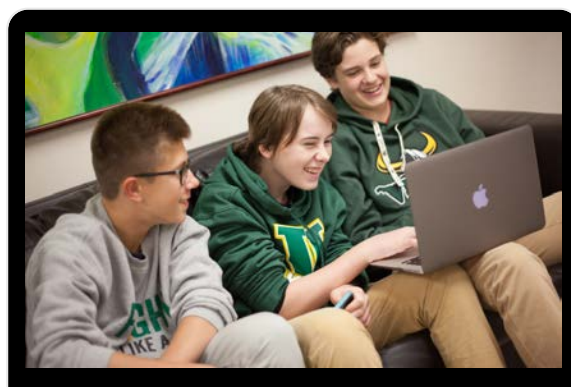
