STAND-UP SPEAK OUT

This past Thursday, a group of Lockerby students had the opportunity to attend the District School Board Senate's first virtual conference, Stand Up for Equity and Inclusion. Inviting students from 10 schools across the school district, the conference tackled topics including racial belonging, justice, and equality. conference included breakout sessions led by Unlearn Sudbury, a group committed to promoting anti-racisim and discrimination, and workshops by get REAL, an organization that fosters inclusivity. Students also had the opportunity to hear from keynote speaker Anthony Johnson, a Two-Spirit, LGBTQ2 and Indigenous advocate originally from Navajo Nation, Arizona. A former contestant of the Amazing Race Canada Season 7, Johnson and his partner have become internationally recognized for their advocacy efforts. Throughout the conference, students had the opportunity to unlearn previous biases and gain new perspectives on what inclusivity and diversity means. At the end of the conference, the Lockerby Team brainstormed various ways they could implement their newfound knowledge in our Viking community, in order to create an even more welcoming and inclusive environment for their peers.






MIDTERM REPORT CARDS (S2T1)



Schools celebrate Music Monday by bringing students together while safely apart

Secondary music teachers in Rainbow Schools have come up with an innovative way to celebrate Music Monday by bringing students together while safely apart. Lasalle Secondary School, Lockerby Composite School, Manitoulin Secondary School and Sudbury Secondary School have joined forces to create a gigantic multitrack recording of a piece called *Through the Eye of the Storm* by Canadian composer Ryan Meeboer.



"We're using a program called Bandlab. It's available for phones and laptops and works across a wide range of operating systems, so it's an ideal platform for remote learning," says music teacher Mike Jensen of Lockerby Composite School. "It lets you add one track at a time while listening to the previous tracks as you record."

Mike Jensen says the project teaches recording techniques while keeping the spirit of the band alive through music making. "It's like building a sandwich one layer at a time." He adds: "Music unites people. It's also a big part of people's lives. Many students who have pursued careers in medicine, law or business have said that music was an important skill building activity. It taught them lessons they continue to draw on in their current fields."



Music teachers in Rainbow Schools have been collaborating extensively since the pandemic began and schools shifted to remote learning. "We pooled our talents to come up with a list of lessons and activities," says Jensen. "That collaboration led to our current project. We not only wanted to make music, we also wanted to share music. Releasing our version of *Through the Eye of the Storm* on Music Monday is relevant for the times. It's a celebration of our collective resilience as a community."



Accepting College Program - Saturday, May 1st, 2021

Students are reminded to login to their Ontario College Application (OCAS) to finalize and accept their college offer. The website link is https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/

University Responses

As of Thursday, May 27th, 2021 every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either: (1) an offer, (2) a refusal, or (3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information.

By Tuesday, June 1st, 2021, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Please note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or are offer incentives, and residence part of the of Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. (https://www.ouac.on.ca/ugrad-tutorials/#respond).

When students are successful in completing the submission process, they will immediately receive a confirmation number online. Students will also receive the confirmation number by email along with a summary of your responses to offers of admission and/or changes to application information. It is important to note that if students do not immediately receive a confirmation number, the response was not saved. Students must then log back into the online application and re-submit the response.

After students submit the response to a university offer of admission, they will be locked out of the online application for one business day. After one business day, students can log back in to the online application to ensure that 'Accepted' is displayed beside the accepted program.


